

### Citizens executive elected

The Halton Hills Concerned Citizens Committee elected its new executive and board of directors at a meeting on April 27.

The new chairman of the committee is Bill Cumsty, who works with the Halton Hills Community Legal Clinic. The former chairman, Bill Johnson, resigned from the position because of his many commitments elsewhere. Reg Benoit was elected treasurer, and Mid Brunski was elected recording secretary.

The board of directors and trustees consists of Marg Hewitt, Bill Johnson and Bill Collier.

The Concerned Citizens Committee arose from the Donstar Committee, which was formed to help employees who were out of a job when the Donstar plant in Georgetown was closed. Members of the committee later decided to take on other community projects.

The committee recently received a \$4,939 grant from the Office of the Secretary of State to hire two students. The students will be conducting surveys of the Georgetown area over a period of 18 weeks. They will be working out of the same office as the students employed by the committee for the women's hostel.

One student will be conducting a survey of the industries in Georgetown, to determine how many of them are owned by local residents, how many are Canadian-owned, the types of people employed and the type of goods produced.—consumer goods or industrial goods.

By determining the answers to these questions, the committee hopes to discover which businesses are buying goods from outside Canada, or from outside the local area. They hope to locate the skills required and set up companies to make the parts which businesses are presently buying from outside the area.

"We hope to set up a number of cottage industries and help increase employment," Mr. Cumsty said. The committee hopes to bring in "half a dozen" industries, and plans to encourage local residents to invest in these industries.

The second student will be surveying non-professional social agencies, such as the Contact Centre and Helping Hand. The survey will provide information about the location of the agency and the types of service provided. By this survey, the committee hopes to discover where services by different organizations overlap, and which areas are not being adequately provided for.

"We'd like to help coordinate the services provided by non-professional agencies," Mr. Cumsty said. The committee plans to increase communication between agencies, in order to provide a better understanding of the services available, he concluded.

### Witnesses convene May 27-28

"Do All Things For the Sake of the Good News" will be the theme for Jehovah's Witnesses' semi-annual circuit convention in Norval, May 27-28.

John Tezak, presiding minister of the Witnesses in the Georgetown-Erin area, comments, "We hear such little good news today. The bad news seems to overshadow the message of Christ, Jesus, one of hope for our future."

The assembly theme is based on Jesus' words at Matthew 24:14, "This good news of the kingdom will be preached throughout the earth." The assembly will climax with the discourse, "Have Faith in the Good News," Sunday at 10 a.m.

The convention centre on Highway 7, one mile west of Mississauga Road, is open to the public. Seats are free. A number of local families from the Georgetown area will attend the largest religious convention in the history of Canada. An international assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses is scheduled July 5 to 9. More than 75,000 delegates are expected to support the gathering, which is to be held at Montreal's famous Olympic site.

John Tezak, spokesman for the local Witnesses, said that this convention will be quite unusual. The program will be carried on simultaneously in seven languages: French, English, Italian, Greek, Portuguese, Spanish and Arabic. Sessions will also be held in Korean and Ukrainian. The convention program will give practical information on human relations. Marriage will be studied in depth and appropriate counsel given to every family member. Young people will receive special attention in several discussions and talks.

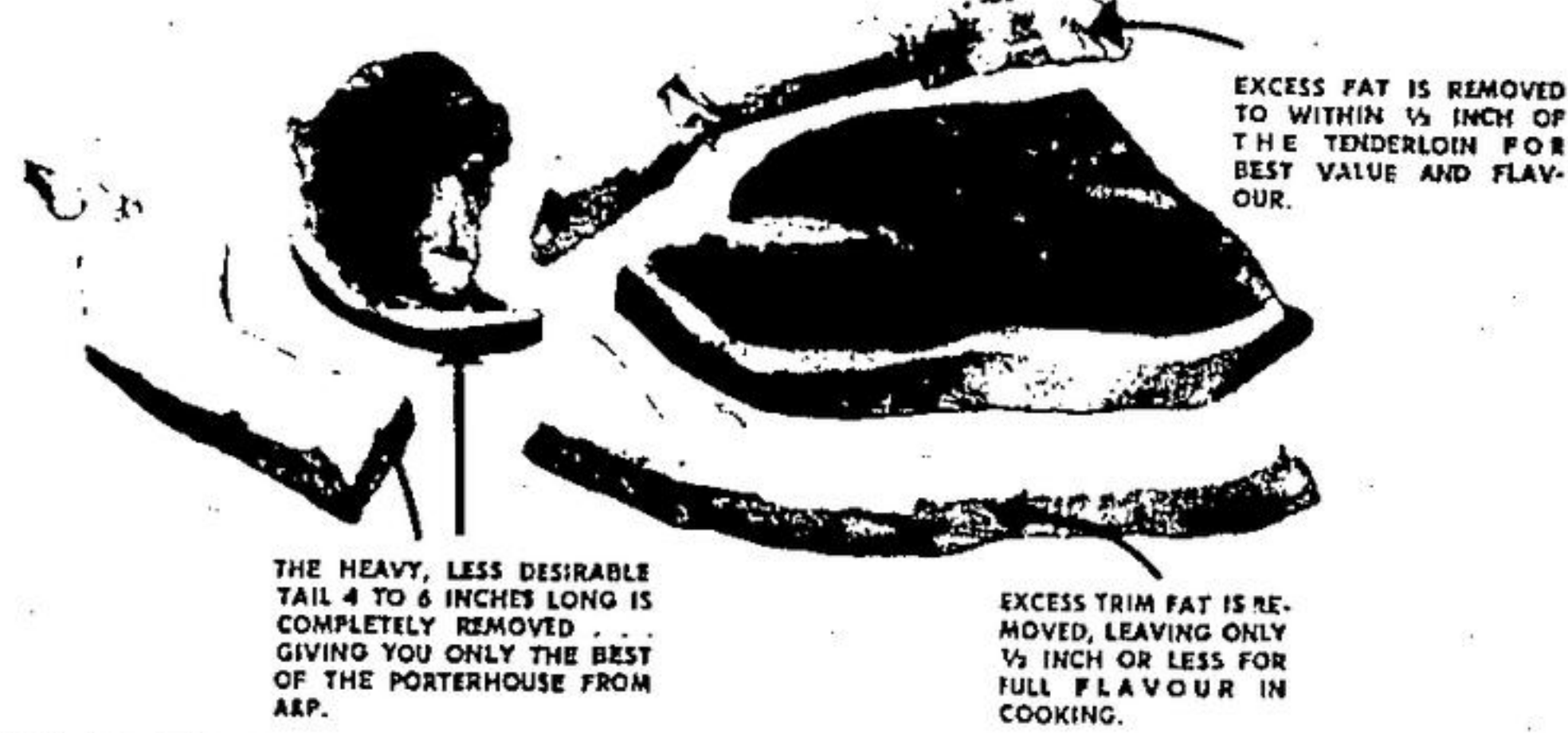
