**Games bigger, better**

The third annual Speyside Highland Games promises to be as good, if not better, than its predecessors. Already more than 350 dancers, 26 pipe bands, 90 individual pipers and drummers and all the heavy event winners from last year have indicated that they will be back to try their luck in 1978.

Although senior citizens will be admitted to the games free again this year, organizers ask them to show identification indicating their age in order to avoid problems with gate records.

Games manager Sandy McAllan says that the dancers' stage has been lengthened to 68 feet for Saturday's competition and extra judges have been hired.

A check is also being made to determine the number of dancers involved in some of the bigger games since it is possible that the Speyside Games may have broken old records for the largest number of dancers registered for a Games.

Piping enthusiasts will be interested in hearing Whitby lawyer Bill Livingstone. Mr. Livingstone won the World Championship at Inverness, Scotland, last summer for his rendition of the Pibroch. He is the first non-Scot to ever hold the title and he will be competing at the Fairgrounds Saturday.

Although Mr. McAllan could not break down figures as to how many bands are entered in each of the four grades, he pointed out that 28 bands competed last year and the number has been equalled in 1978. Loto Canada, Armstrong Holdings, Nielson Company, and Bencard Rum Company are participating in the Grade 1 to 4 competitions, he says.

In order to save time this year the bands will march past en masse instead of individually at the beginning of the band competition.

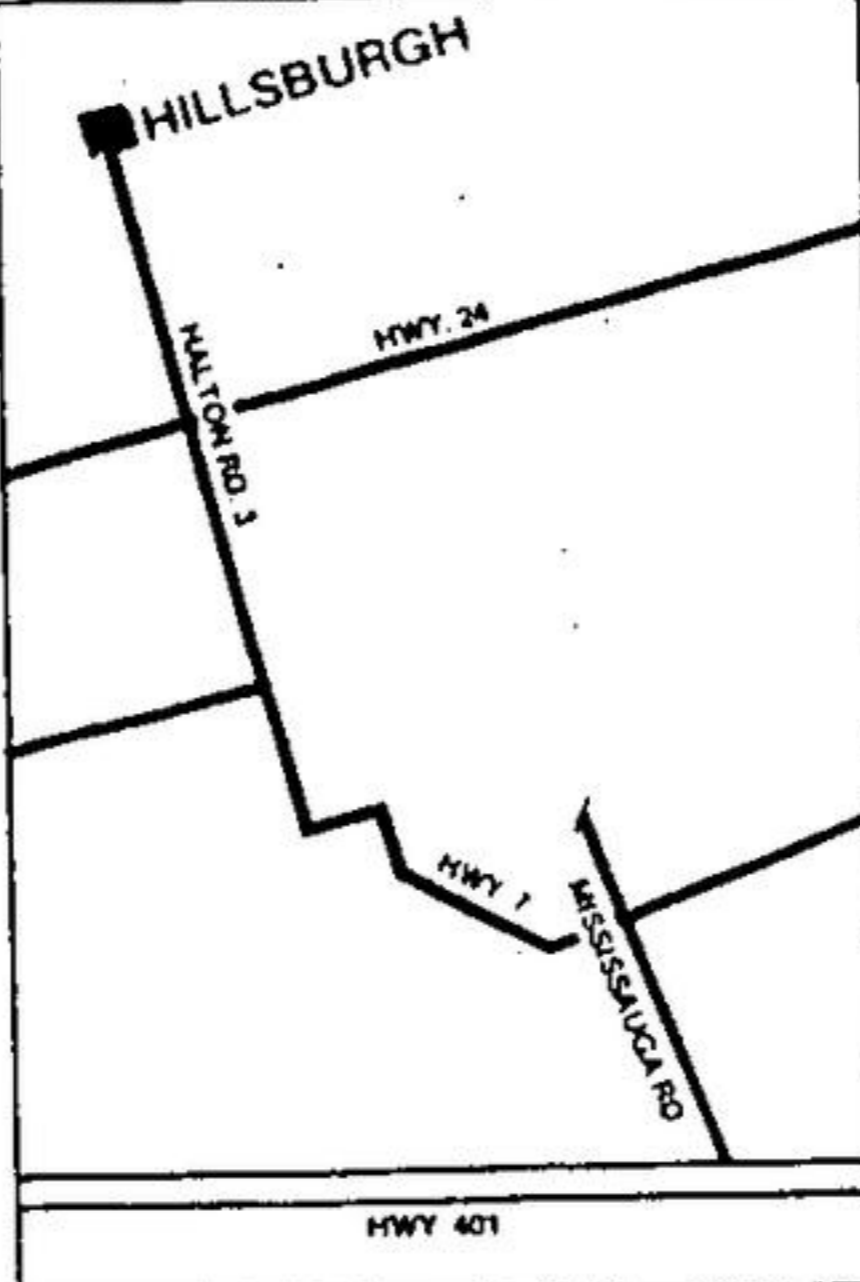
