

120 grade eight students visit US

On Tuesday, May 16, 1978 120 Centennial grade 8 students, 5 parents and 4 staff members departed on three Maple Leaf Way buses from Centennial Public School for Gettysburg.

On the way we stopped in Corning, New York and toured the Corning Glass Centre building.

We saw how the quality of glass progressed from 2,500 years ago to the present. Some wonderful pieces of art that were produced in the Steuben Glass factory were also viewed.

From Corning New York, we travelled to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, taking 4 hours, then we ate dinner. As we were a little behind schedule at that point we went to our Howard Johnson Motel rooms to prepare for the busy day ahead.

At 7:30 on May 17th we ate breakfast. After checking out of our motel, we proceeded to Gettysburg Military Park close by.

On the Visitors' Centre we saw many interesting items that were salvaged from the Civil War.

The Electric Map was another fascinating display that presented the battle of Gettysburg in flashing lights. This battle marked the turning point of the Civil War.

A guided tour of the Gettysburg battlefield followed. The original Civil War battle defences and memorials gave us a more vivid idea of the actual battle.

In the afternoon most of us went to the Civil War Museum where we saw many interesting Civil War characters including Abraham Lincoln, General Meade, Jefferson Davis, and General Grant.

The direct trip to Washington that afternoon only took an hour and a half from Gettysburg. We had our first glimpse of the lovely city on our way to the Smithsonian Institute.

This consists of buildings near Jefferson Drive. The unlimited number of fascinating displays and inventions certainly delighted all the students.

After we checked into our accommodation we ate dinner and then visited the National Air and Space Museum. There we saw everything to do with air and space throughout history.

Many of us saw a fabulous movie called "To Fly". It was the type of cinema movie which makes you feel as if you are actually in the aircraft. We fell wearily into bed that night anticipating our tour of Washington on the following day.

After breakfast we met our guides for a full day guided tour on Thursday, May 18.

We saw all the main attractions in the beautiful city of Washington. They included John F. Kennedy's grave, the Lincoln Memorial, the Jefferson Memorial, the Washington monument, the State Capital building and the White House.

Included in our tour was a very impressive visit to the F.B.I. building. All of us saw many interesting methods of defending the law and locating criminals that we had never known before. I'm sure most of us learned more of that subject in that hour than we would ever hope to learn from television in a lifetime.

After that outstanding tour, we drove through an exceptionally beautiful street where all of the embassies are located. From there we took our guides back. After dinner many of us went to see a movie.

On May 19th, we departed from Washington at 9:30 a.m., heading straight to Georgetown, making necessary stops en route. Finally we arrived at Centennial school at approximately 7:30 p.m., tired but very pleased and happy after our wonderful holiday.

Test Freeze

If you have doubts as to how well a fruit or vegetable will freeze, test it before freezing large quantities. Freeze three or four packages and sample the food after freezing. Almost any type of cooked meat, stew, ragout or goulash—beef, lamb, pork or veal—can be frozen. Most vegetables used in these combination foods, such as peas, carrots, celery or onions, also freeze well. Cooked dry beans freeze especially well.
