

Milton court, registry office officially opened

Four provincial cabinet ministers and a group of local dignitaries were greeted with a light shower of rain when they gathered Monday morning to officially open the Milton Courthouse Extension and Registry Office.

As a result of the rain, the ceremony was kept short, with each of the platform party members confining himself to brief congratulations. Deputy Attorney-General Allan Leal acted as chairman for the

ceremony. Solicitor-General George Kerr, Consumer and Commercial Relations Minister Larry Grossman, Transportation and Communications Minister James Snow and Government Services Minister Lorne Henderson took part in the ceremony.

Also in attendance were Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed, Halton Region Chairman Ric Morrow, Milton Mayor Don Gordon and a number of Milton and Halton Hills councillors.

Mr. Henderson presented the ribbon to the new court and registry office, which were previously located in Milton and Halton Hills.

The estimated cost of the project was \$2.6 million. The land registry office on the main floor contains a registry and land titles section, personal property registration office and document search and reproduction areas.

The additional space allotted to the provincial court (criminal division) contains two pro-

vincial courtrooms, judges' quarters, interview rooms, legal library, public area and administration offices. The basement contains mechanical and electrical equipment and holding facilities for prisoners awaiting trial.

The registry office in Milton is one of the ten busiest in Ontario, and handles over 40,000 registrations a year. The first registry office in Milton was opened in 1854.

Mr. Grossman, in a text of his remarks, released prior to

delivery said registry offices are being faced with an increased demand for services, but the government does not have the resources to keep building more offices and hiring additional staff.

"We must concentrate instead on greater efficiency and productivity in order to handle the increasing load," he said.

"New facilities like this office, with adequate space, efficient design and computerization, allow us to accomplish this objective more easily."
