Q. What is the church seating if the groom's parents are A. His mother sits in the

front right-hand pew, the father in the third.

Q. Does the groom always kiss the bride at the altar? A. The clergyman will rule on It, according to church practice.

Q. Who gives clergyman A. The groom pays, but best man hands it over in plain white envelope, before or after ceremony.

Q. Is the clergyman invited to the reception?

A. Yes, with his wife. He sits at parents table.

Q. May a house wedding be just as formal as a church A. Yes, although there are never as many attendants.

Q. Is there usually a recessional at a home wedding? A. The married couple turn around after ceremony and

elaborate receptions. Q. How should invitations be inserted in envelope? A. Invitation is folded with the wording outside and put in the inner envelope (which has no gum on flap) with the folded edge down. The Inner envelope is then placed in the

outer one facing the flap.

Q. When should invitations and announcements be or-A. About two months before the wedding.
