## NDP members attacks Masson appointment

The appointment of former Halton regional chairman Allan Masson, 64, as interim trustee for Georgina Township Sutton, Ontario, came under attack Friday from a New Democratic member of the legislative assembly (MLA).

Mel Swart, the NDP's municipal affairs critic, expressed surprise and unhappiness at the appointment, announced last week by provincial minister of intergovernmental offairs Darcy McKeough following the dissolution of Georgina township council after election irregularitles were discover-

Mr. Swart charged that naming Halton's first regional chairman defeated in his 1976 bid for re-appointment to handle the affairs of Georgina township until another election can be held is an insult to the taxpayers of Georgina.

The Welland-Thorold MLA acknowledged Mr. Masson's extensive political experience as an asset to his new job in Georgina, but called upon Mr. McKeough to rescind his decision and either allow an early by-election or appoint an interim council of Georgina citizens. to serve until fall.

Members of the interim council could be paid a flat honorarium for their service which would save the township a great deal out of Mr. Masson's salary of \$150 per day, Mr. Swart said.

Mr. McKeough has declined to call a special election for the 18,000 residents of Georgina township, citing the Municipal Elections Act legislation prohibiting by-elections between March 31 and November, 1978. Mr. Swart suggested that

Mr. McKeough could call the special election anyway and later have it retroactive, validated through the appropriate legislation at the beginning of Queen's Park's fall session. The Elections Act is due for some revision at any rate, Mr. Swart added.

Mr. McKeough and Mr. Masson joked about the singularity of the appointment as it was announced at a news conference, calling it "majority government in the best sense of


