The provincial government's decide to what extent it will Booth motioned that the arecent decision to finance children's services in Halton region could be a political "ploy" aimed at eliminating the Children's Aid Society. Milton Coun Jim Kerr speculated at last week's regional health and social services committee meeting

Halton chief administrative officer Ernest Reid informed the committee that a recent meeting with representatives of the ministry of health indicated that funding for the service in Halton is being lined up. but the province has yet to

subsidize a regional program and through what agency the program should in no way funds will be administered. A volunteer steering com-

mittee has been established to monitor current services and work with regional officials to prepare the program, Mr. Reid explained.

Coun. Kerr commented that the news makes the Children's Aid Society "a big question mark". The province could either place it soley in charge of the service funding or eliminate it altogether, he said. Halton Hills Coun. Roy

\$115,000 estimate for Stewarttown bridge

committee last week recommended approval of a \$115,000 reconstruction project for a portion of regional road 15 (15 Sideroad) which involves the replacement of a badly dilapidated bridge just west of Trafalgar Road.

The committee agreed that the bridge, one side of which broke off and fell into the stream beneath the bridge last May, should be replaced with a 20-ton, 32-foot wide concrete structure. Since breaking apart, the bridge has been

Region to buy lands for road

Regional council today (Wednesday) is expected to approve the purchase of four parcels of land along Trafalgar Road for the planned widening and reconstruction of the road between Ashgrove

and Slewarltown. The regional public works committee last week endorsed plans to buy the parcels, which represented the ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth of 30 propertiles to be acquired for the widening project. A total of \$145,000 has been hudgeted for the acquisitions.

The regional public works limited to single-lane traffic and vehicles of less than 2.2 tons in weight.

Public works director Bob" Moore also proposed improvements to the road alignment to be carried out at the same time, requiring the acquisition of roadside property from two private owners.


