**Speaker not from GARA**

To the editor of The Herald: It has been brought to my attention that an article in the July 19 edition of The Herald referred to Council's withdrawal of support of the Georgetown Ratepayers Association. As far as I am aware there is no such formally-constituted group in existence.

Mr. Roebuck certainly not speaking on behalf of the newly formed Georgetown Area Ratepayers Association (G.A.R.A.) nor was he a member of the group when he addressed Council regarding the Edward Street cluster housing development. My understanding is that he represented a group of residents in the immediate area of the proposed development, some of whom happen to be members of our association. G.A.R.A. did not take stand on the cluster home issue primarily because we did not have an adequate background in the matter. If we had been in operation a little longer it is conceivable that assistance might have been given to the area residents, but this assistance would only have been given once the executive had satisfied themselves that a genuine need existed.

G.A.R.A. definitely intends to keep itself posted on future developments affecting the ratepayers of the community as a whole. In this regard each director of our organization has been given responsibility for maintaining contact with ratepayers and issues in his or her area. Also, G.A.R.A. has initiated an investigation of the development proposals south of Georgetown and will make its findings public prior to any O.M.B. hearings related to this matter.

The Georgetown Area Ratepayers' Association is committed to fostering a productive relationship between the Town's ratepayers and its elected officials which will benefit all residents of the Georgetown area. We are working towards this objective and are concerned by any report which indicates otherwise.
