
Steam Era weekend record success

An estimated 15,000 people from across southern Ontario attended the four-day Steam Era held this weekend at the Milton fairgrounds.

Excellent weather and an exciting programme of events and activities helped make the Ontario Steam and Antique Preservers Association Inc. show a record-setting success. It was the eighteenth conseculive year owners of the antique tractors, steam engines, gas engines, cars and saw mill equipment had gathered in Milton to compare notes, have some fun and display their unique remnants from the

Among the special events keeping the crowds thoroughly entertained were a country and western talent contest on Saturday and professional country and gospet singing by the Edwards Family.

Eight years after it was initially proposed, the twostorey motel-restaurant complex planned for construction on Highway 7 at Delrex Bouleapproved by the town planning

Galaxy Holdings Ltd. has drastically revised the plans originally presented to the former Georgetown council in 1970 by Aler and Company. The current proposal, subject to site plan agreement, will feature approximately 32 suites, a single-storey lounge building and a single-storey restaurant on a three-acre site on the north side of the highway adjacent to North Halton Mot-

Planning board approved the proposal last Tuesday without comment, noting a staff recommendation which stipulated that a detailed site plan must first be endorsed by the town engineer and planning director, as well as reglonal council.

The proposal placed before Georgetown council eight years ago involved a 22-suite motel and two apartment buildings each containing 79 units. vard in Georgetown has been. The motel proposal alone was approved and the Highway 7 site rezoned for commercial

In January, 1976, Galaxy Holdings Ltd. acquired the Aler and Company plans and subsequently proposed a fivestorey apartment hotel complex for the site. More recent revisions resulted in the omission of the apartment proposal and the relocation of the dining and lounge facilities in separate buildings.

Among the concerns expressed by the departments to which the proposal has been circulated are reservations about policing the site and the servicing of the site with sewage treatment capacity.


