\$10,000 spent on bldg. repair
Less than three years after a public outcry prompted town council to temporarily abandon plans for a new municipal administration complex, deteriorating conditions at the existing municipal building on Trafalgar Road have forced the town to spend \$10,000 on repairs.

Council Monday night authorized clerk-administrator Ken Richardson to make arrangements for the replacement of the building's 12 wooden-frame windows at a cost not to exceed \$10,000.

Mr. Richardson advised council that the rotting sills on the building's upper floor are allowing rain water to seep into the offices on the west and east sides. Although the town in its budget for the administration building, Mr. Richardson reported, some of that amount was to have been allocated to the installation of an air ventilation system in the downstairs council chambers.

Mr. Richardson informed council that two local contractors have provided estimates for the replacement of the wooden sills with aluminum frames, the lowest of which totals \$9,966. The low bid was offered by Mountclair Developments Ltd. The contractor is aware that the building will be renovated at some future date, Mr. Richardson added.

Coun. Russ Miller speculated that some of the windows might be eliminated in order to save some money and suggested that such a move should be considered when Mr. Richardson awards the contract for the work.
