

MONEY MONTHLY open mortgages



Major banking institutions are following the lead of smaller companies and introducing open mortgages. Recently, two major banks announced open mortgage plans whereby a borrower is not penalized for prepayments on his mortgage.

This comes only two months after the introduction by one company of completely open mortgages which permit unlimited prepayments without penalty.

An open mortgage allows the borrower to pay any amount at any time on his mortgage. That is, by paying off part of the mortgage, aside from regular payments, the borrower can substantially reduce his amortization period and the amount of interest he pays.

The open mortgage plans recently announced by the two banking institutions both charge an extra quarter point of interest above the going conventional mortgage rate (1014 percents for the privilege of prepayment. The deal is that, for the extra quarter point of interest, no penalty is incurred if borrowers pay off their mortgages before the expiration of the mortgage

Until recently, an open mortgage usually meant that a borrower could make a prepayment or prepayments on his mortgage but only in accordance with certain provisions. Some required a three month notice, others allowed only one prepayment date during a five-year term, and in most, prepayment was accompanied by a three month to six month interest penalty.

Another open mortgage plan, announced last May by a smaller company, is completely open at no extra charge to the borrower. There is no added interest charge to the going mortgage rate. All that is required is a three month notice before prepayment. Loans can be arranged for up to 95 percent of the combined value of your home and land. And, if the required documentation is available, it can be processed within 24 hours. Now you may well ask why all this talk about open mort-

gages, anyway? What are the advantages? The reasoning behind open mortgages is that, through prepayments, no matter how small, the total amortization period and consequently the interest payments can be reduced.

For example, if we take a \$60,000 mortgage, amortized over 25 years at a rate of 11 percent, we see that monthly payments are \$577.53 and that the total cost of the mortgage comes to \$173.239,77.

Now, if the borrower in question makes a monthly prepayment of \$20.00, the mortgage would be paid off in 21 years and seven months, with a net saving of \$19,024.61.

. If the borrower makes a prepayment of \$100, per month instead, then the amortization period would be reduced to 16 years and two months, with a net reduction in mortgage payments of \$46,734.22!

From this example, then, it is obvious that the borrower can reap substantial savings through prepayments on his mortgage. And if you're a homeowner, regular prepayments will give the satisfaction of owning your own home that much sooner.

It's simply a fact that more and more consumers are interested in shorter, more flexible, loan terms and it's a lender's responsibility to find new and inventive ways to respond to these demands. Open mortgages are one such way,



COMPACT SPLIT ENTRY IN COUNTRY STYLE

Here's a charmingly rustic design which possesses all of the modern conveniences necessary to an urban lifestyle and which would make an appealing town home for the smaller family with a narrow frontage building, lot. The vertical channel 'siding and stone veneer and chimney of the exterior are complemented by the country. style accents on the dining room window and the single garage door.

The wide weather-protected entrance leads into a compact reception foyer which: faces the staircase downtto the family and recreation area of the lower level or up to the main living area of the home. The main landing leads naturally right into the large convivial living room, which features a centrally-positioned fireplace and excellent natural lighting.

The large L-shaped kitchen-nook combination has generous counter work area and the casual nook area invites the installation of custom-built breakfast nook furnishings. Convenient pocket doors separate the kitchen-nook from the main hallway and the large formal dining room. Access to this latter from the kitchen is direct, yet

separation of formal and casual dining is still maintained. All three bedrooms are positioned around the central bath and linen storage area and all have excellent natural lighting and generous closet storage. The large master bedroom has full-width closets behind louvered bi-fold doors and a three-piece ensuite

with tub and a window for gentle natural light in the morning. The lower level contains the family or recreation room, depending upon family requirements and preferences, and space for the future development of additional bedrooms or further recreational facilities.

A single enclosed garage, with space for the installation of a workbench for the maintenance-minded handyman, completes the conveneince features of this practical and attractive design.
