

Rabies are on increase

Rabies may increase above normal levels in parts of southern Ontario in the coming months, Natural Resources Minister James A.C. Auld said the 1978-79 season is the tenth year since the disease last occurred, and there was a major outbreak before that in 1958-59.

"If this 10-year cycle recurs, a peak can be expected this fall and winter," Mr. Auld said.

Outbreaks of rabies have already occurred in Bruce, Carleton, Frontenac, Grey, Lanark, Leeds, Lincoln and Renfrew Counties, with red fox and striped skunk being the major carriers.

Ontario Outdoors

WALLEYE: Late fall is probably the best time to get yourself a trophy walleye, and the Moon River is likely the best place.
 Those dedicated Walleye fishermen who only want the biggest and best, and who head to the Moon River system when there is frost on the ground and the threat of ice on the water, are almost guaranteed a catch of super big "Goldies" for their efforts.
 The season is open until March 31, 1979 and pike until the same date with the mighty muskie closing on Nov. 30 in zones 15 and 16 and on Dec. 15 in zone No. 7.
 Muskie fishing is hot and the largest of the year are generally taken now but pike is a little slower but the fish are BIG.
 The secret is to fish S-L-O-W and RAPAL'S are probably the favoured lure due to its minnow imitating shape. Vary the size and color of the lure until you hit with success and when the action drops off, change again.
SALMON: Obviously some of the Salmon have spawned on the Lake shore or on off shore shoals and died in the lake. This is a fairly common occurrence if the rivers are not fit to run for one reason or another. The fish of course do not run up river then, and the recent shortage of heavy rains would show this to be true.
 There are very few Salmon in the Credit River and a lot of people are questioning the whereabouts of the majority of the fish.
 There is still a lot of SNAGGING going on and this is ILLEGAL. A conservation officer has the right to inspect your tackle and tackle box and charges will be laid for any violation. A recent catch by an honest fisherman was brought to me and had a large treble hook on a leader with a heavy weight was in its back. While talking to FRED HOWSE of Norval he told me of a snagging hook that was brought to him that was obviously intended for TUNA RIGS for Ocean fishing or for shark fishing. It was so big that he had not seen its like in all his days of fishing.
 Some people are going to a lot of work to take fish illegally. If you see anyone snagging fish, then you would be wise to stop your own fishing and head to a phone report it. Just call Zenith 2-5800 which is a no charge number for the Ministry of Natural Resources and report the time, location and the description of the person involved.
 Don't be afraid to give your name, although it is not mandatory. You will be doing your part in making a better name for the sportsmen of Ontario. I spoke to Ron Jean-Marie, a conservation officer with the Ministry on Friday October 27, 1978 regarding this, and the charges are quite heavy.
 Duck Hunting is still good, and the Canvasback duck is the last to come down from the north. This rugged individual sometimes sticks around until he skids on the ice covering the waterways.
RABIES may increase above normal levels here in the coming months. There was a major outbreak in the fall and winter of 1958-59, and again in the same period in 1968-69. This indicates a general 10 year cycle of major outbreaks of Rabies. Rabid animals frequently show tendencies to be tame, and any animal with odd behavioral tendencies should be avoided.
 Even dead animals could transmit the disease. Sportsmen using dogs should exercise great care in the field to ensure his dog does not make contact with an infected fox or skunk as these are the most often affected. When was the last time you did something to improve the image of sportsmen in ONTARIO OUTDOORS????

Budget increase affects works

The possibility that Halton region's public works department may have to reduce its present level of servicing in order to hold an anticipated budget increase for 1979 to a minimum was under discussion at last Wednesday's public works committee meeting.
 "I think the taxpayers would be willing to give up some services," committee chairman Jack Raitis speculated. "Private industry is doing it and we sure need it here. I think council would accept the idea."
 Chief administrative officer Ernie Reid questioned the wisdom of such a proposal, however, noting that clerical staff for the region is "at a bare minimum now". Staff members are hard put to prepare necessary reports on time already without facing further cutbacks in personnel and programmes, he said.
RELOCATION HOPE
 Public works director Bob Moore informed the committee that he hopes to relocate some personnel at Halton's various water and sewage treatment plants to increase their collective effectiveness.
 Mr. Moore pointed out that water and sewer services must be kept up in more or less the same level, in accordance with provincial environmental and health standards. Road servicing is one area where the level of servicing could possibly be reduced, he added.
 It could be "impossible" for his department to maintain the current level of servicing in any area if public works are to follow regional council's suggested guideline of holding increases for 1979 to three per cent, Mr. Moore said.
 Burlington Coun. Vern Connell supported Conn. Raitis' suggestion that the public would probably be willing to accept cutbacks in services. He recalled that his municipality was forced to cut back on its road salting and faced no complaints from citizens.
 The public works budget outline was forwarded to Halton's incoming council for further consideration.
