Large tour packages have pared the cost of a vacation in Hawaii, making it possible for millions to see the Islands. But some people prefer a less structured vacation and a slower pace, yet hesitate because they've heard Hawaii s expensive.

The average visitor spends about \$50 per day: many spend much more. Yet it is possible to spend less and see and do more with a little know-how.

You can save quite a lot to start with, by taking the middle of the week econonly flights. Most are without frills and special services; some do not have telephones or maid service. Not as elegant as major hotels, they are comfortable, private, and affordable and the money saved an more than pay for a rental car. As Hawaii is a oopular year-round vacation spot, it is wise to make reservations for all accom-

modations well in advance. Food in Hawaii is deicious and exotic, reflecting the rich, cultural diversity of the island people. It doesn't have to be expensive. A \$3.00 meat in a mall family restaurant can sometimes rival highly adertised Laute cuisine costing four to five times as much. Fresh island fruits ire served everywhere. Paoaya and pineapple at lunch counters costs less but tastes the same as that erved in hotel dining
