Pay envelopes are stolen

An Erin man reported that he had parked his company truck at the rear of the Dominion Hotel in Acton, and while it was parked there, an unknown vehicle ran into the side of the truck. Traces of brown paint were found in the damaged area of the vehicle. Damage to the truck is estimated at \$400.

A Georgetown man reported that his car, a green Oldsmobile, was struck in the front left fender by an Austin-Marina, red in colour, on November 15. The vehicle was last seen eastbound on Highway 7.

A Georgetown man has been charged with possession of stolen goods after 25 cartons of cigarettes of various brands were found in his possession. The cigarettes were the property of Benson and Hedges Tobacco in Brampton.

Burglars gained entry to a garage in Esqueving Township by cutting a padlock on the door and stole a 360 Chrysler Engine, 8 connecting rods for

340 engines and numerous carburetor parts. The 12-volt battery was stolen from a pick-up truck parked at the Dominion Hotel in Acton on Friday night.

A panel in a bay door was forced open to gain entry to a factory in Acton, but nothing appeared to have been taken, police report.

Negotiations resume

Negotiators for the Halton elementary and secondary school teachers met last week for the first time since the province appointed a factfinder last month to investigate the stalled contract talks.

Board of education members met with high school teachers November 15 and met behind closed doors that evening to discuss the factfinder's report. Board negotiators met with elementary school teachers November 16.

This year is the first time teachers have begun the school year without a contract. Salaries, seniority and the pupil-teacher ratio are items which have caused problems in the talks.

Guidelines for factfinders state that unless an agreement has been reached within 15 to 21 days, the factfinder's report will be made public. The factfinder is allowed a certain amount of flexibility, however, in that, if he feels talks are going well, he may extend the time limit.
