



Philbrook's plan is considered

OTTAWA - External Affairs Minister Don Jamieson has said he will examine the merits of a suggestion by Frank Philbrook (L-Haltun) to establish an office concerned with the problem of world population.

Philbrook claimed in the House of Commons that the problem is still very serious in spite of some recent encouraging reports and that it is now being studied by an international group of parliamentarians. He suggested that a specific population "desk" be set up in the external affairs ministry, the Canadian International Development Agency or the International Development Research Centre.

"I am not exactly sure what the formulation ought to be or what technique ought to be employed, but certainly I will look into it and see if there is some merit in having a special centre either in CIDA or in external affairs in order to coordinate these kinds of activities on a world scale," the minister replied.

Morton bids board farewell

Former Halton board of education chairman Garry Morton listed a number of highlights in his tenure as chairman in his farewell remarks at the board's inaugural meeting Thursday night, including the election of Halton Hills trustee Barry Shepherd to the board.

Mr. Shepherd was elected earlier this year to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of trustee Don Long. Reeve Morton admitted that the mention of Mr. Shepherd's joining the board might seem a little strange choice as a highlight, but he said that it must have been difficult for Mr. Shepherd to join a group which had been together as one unit for some time, but that he had managed to fit in to the group very quickly, and make a real contribution to the board.

Other highlights Rev. Morton mentioned were the setting of the objectives for the past two years, and the achievements reflected in those objectives, including the expansion of the core curriculum, pupil testing for individual achievement and for success of the board's programs, and financial controls.

Rev. Morton said this is the fifth straight meeting when financial restraint had been set as the board's main priority, and said that thanks to the efforts of superintendent of business and finance Bruce Lindley and his staff, the Halton board of education usually finds itself within its spending budgets.

Rev. Morton said there are at least four major tasks facing the board immediately, including the board's collective agreement with its secondary and elementary school teachers, the setting of the aims and objectives for the next two years, the 1979 budget and the decision of whether to remain with the Ontario Public School Boards Association, or to join the Large Boards of Ontario Association.

Rev. Morton expressed his appreciation to the administration, director of education Em Lavender, the board members, and vice-chairman Len Augner for their co-operation and hard work.

"You've made it a privilege and a long-cherished honor (to be chairman) and for that I thank you all very much," he said.

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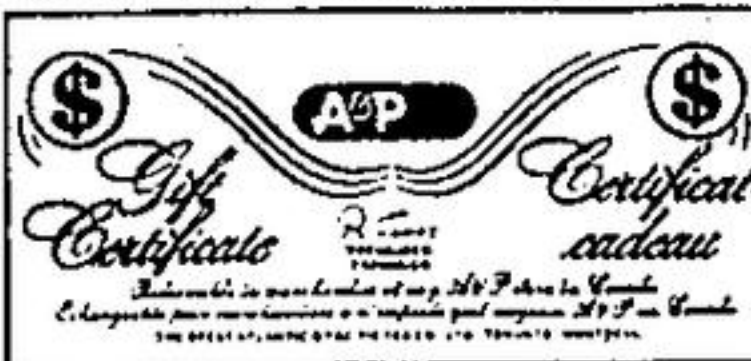
