Try geting on your knees and imagine that three to four feet was your total growth expectancy. You wouldn't even make it to the top of most store counters.

One young girl in the show spoke of an ambition to be a nurse - if she could reach the top of the beds.

MEDICALREASON The reason for this particular medical deformity is well known - they even have a way of correcting the problem. The answer is in the pituitary gland which secretes the growth hormone. When this gland is damaged do to disease or birth defect the result is dwarfism. 
