Rebels shooting not sharp in loss to West Humber

The Georgetown district high school senior basketball, Rebels had a poor outing at home last Wednesday losing to Etobicoke's West Humber Collegiate 64-46.

However, the loss did not worry Rebel coach Moe Leeking who said, "It is still very early in the year. We're still experimenting, using different styles and as many players as possible."

West Humber had things their own way in the first quarter, coming out of it leading 14-7.

The Rebels had a strong second quarter and at the half it was all tied at 25.

The third quarter saw the visitors take the lead again and when it ended they had 46-40 score in their favor.

The Rebels turned the ball over time and time again in the final quarter and when it was over West Humber had the 16-point bulge.

Leeking said it was poor shooting on the part of the Rebels that cost them the game. The Rebels shot 37 per cent from the field and only 58 per cent from the foul line.

Forward John Karolidis had a solid game leading his team in points with 11 and also in rebounds with seven.

Centre Steve Keslick also fared well as he scored eight and pulled down six rebounds.

Bill Rivers was second in Rebel scoring to Karolidis with nine points.

Mark Nelstrop, Gord Miller and Rick Fisher all had four points.

The regular season begins January 10 so Leeking still has plenty of time to experiment with his personnel.
