Rebels dominate meet

The Georgetown district high school wrestling Rebels had an excellent day at their own warmup tournament as 19 of their 26 wrestlers finished fourth or better.

Coaches Bob McKay and Ray Smith were both very pleased with the showing made by their young team. There were no official team stats kept. McKay said his statistics showed the Rebels winning, Lakeport coming second and Kitchener Collegiate third.

There were 247 wrestlers competing at the tournament which took place Saturday.

Three Rebels went all the way taking first in their respective divisions.

Kevin Frank was first at 93.5 pounds, Mike Wroblewski was tops in the 100-pound class and Joe Ibuki emerged as the victory at 122 pounds.

Frank and Wroblewski are rookies on the team. Six other Rebels finished second. Among them was Peter Fournier, a defending OFSAA champion.

McKay and Smith are against having Fournier wrestle heavier competitors in the early season matches. Saturday he wrestled at 130 pounds. He lost to Terry Karn of KCI

3-1 in their match. The Rebels' Jerry Paul also was in the division and came in a very respectable fourth.

Frank Midzinski also finished second. He lost on a tie to Lakeport's Tim Calder at 115.5 pounds.

Mark DeFueck was second at 100 pounds, Kevin Gillespie second at 100 pounds, Chuck Anderson the same at 87 pounds and Dean Scallen was the same 137.5 pounds.

The third-place Rebel finishers were Barry Stone (107.5), John Hofdahl (122), Bill Davis (122), Randy Robinson (159.5), and Ken Ward (144). (There were different classes in most

divisions for experienced and non-experienced wrestlers).

The fourth-place finishes were recorded by Jim Wittmeyer (93.5), Dave Allan (100), Jerry Paul (130), Pat Jacobs (137.5), and Rick Widmont (159.5).

Other Rebels competing were Jeff Sargent, Don Turner, Todd Bradley, Kevin Brown, Jeff Wood and Rob Hughes.

This week the Rebels will travel to Hamilton to compete in a meet there. McKay and his troops are looking forward to the meet as it should be a good measuring stick as to how strong the team can be this year.
