Swimming Rebels second at meet in Scarborough

The Georgetown district high school swim team placed second to the host Cedarbrae at a meet on Saturday.

Cedarbrae was the runaway winner in the meet which was just for boys.

Rebel coach Tom Adams said his team has been hit with the flu bug and 11 of his swimmers were sick in bed the day of the meet.

"I expected to take 24 boys with me," Adams said. "Cedarbrae simply outmanned us.

They had four or five swimmers to our one."

The coach said Cedarbrae, a perennial swimming power, would probably have taken first place had the Rebels been at full strength, but that it would have been much closer.

Several of the Rebels who did make it to the meet fared very well.

Two relay teams were both in the top five. Mark Payne and Andy Bigg, Kevin Thompson and Gord Payne finished third in the senior boys 200 medley

and Steve Crowe, Mark Pelletier, Kevin Thompson and Doug Crowe were fourth in the 400-metre freestyle relay.

Doug Crowe pulled off the Rebels' only first place showing of the day when he touched first in the senior boys 50-metre freestyle.

Doug also finished second in the 200-metre free and his brother Steve had the same

finish in the 100-metre butterfly event.

Three other Rebels had fifth place showings. Steve Crowe in the 200-metre freestyle, Eric Elson in the 50-metre fly (junior) and Marc Pelletier in the 100-metre butterfly.

There were 27 schools represented at the meet, so the Rebels second place showing was very good.

Major Pee Wees win twice
