## GEORGETOWN HYDRO ELECTRIC COMMISSION RETAIL RATES

### JANUARY 1st, 1979

First 250 kWh per month 4.35 cents per kWh  
2.75 cents for all additional monthly consumption.

### METERED WATER HEATING

A block of 500 kWh per month at a special rate of 2.6 cents per kWh uncontrolled and 2.4 cents per kWh controlled is available to customers using an approved electric water heater supplied through the residential service meter after 250 kWh per month have been billed at the fore-going rate. Minimum monthly bill \$3.50.

### GENERAL SERVICE RATE

Demand charge: First 50 kilowatts of billing demand per month Nil.  
Balance at \$2.60 per kilowatt of billing demand per month.

Energy Charge:  
First 250 kWh per month 4.35 cents per kWh,  
Next 9,750 kWh per month 3.3 cents per kWh,  
Balance at 2.05 cents per kWh.

The General Rate is based upon service at utilization voltage; where the customer provides transformation facilities, the authorized allowance of 25 cents per K.W. per month for stepdown from subtransmission voltage and 15 cents per K.W. per month for stepdown from distribution voltage will apply.  
Minimum Monthly Bill - Under 50 K.W., - \$3.50 - Over 50 K.W., - 25 cents per K.W. for all K.W. applicable to the maximum demand during the previous eleven month.

### DELAYED PAYMENT

A late payment of 5 per cent shall apply to bills not paid on or before due date.

An anti-inflation discount of 4.2 percent received from Ontario Hydro on bulk power purchased will be reflected in the calculation by Georgetown Hydro of customer accounts in 1979. Billings will be prorated so that 1978 consumption will be charged at existing rates.
