Trees planted

Site inspections are almost completed for the planting of more than 100,000 shrubs and trees of various species in the Credit River Watershed early in 1979.

Under the Credit Valley Conservation Authority's private land reforestation program, 85,000 seedling trees will be planted for landowners in the valley.

Approximately 20,000 trees will be planted on Authority lands and 1,000 shrubs and larger trees will provide landscaping in the multiple-use conservation areas.

Plans are now being formulated for erosion-control planting projects in 1979 from the Authority nursery in Meadowvale.

The Authority reforestation, erosion control and nursery projects are under the direction of Forest Technician, Robert Baker.
