August 16 - The Georgeown and District Hospital has laid off staff in an effort to operate within budget restrictions dietated by the Onlario government's 4.5 per cent increase in the hospital's operating grant.

. August 23 — Halton regional chairman Ric Morrow, a Georgetown resident, announces his intentions to retire from public life to spend more time with his family.

 Nellie Pitt, a counsellor at the Countryside residence for the mentally retarded in Hornby, and president of the union local at the home is fired for what she calls "no just cause," Ms. Pill files a grievance with the Ontario Labour Relations Board as a result.

SEPTEMBER September 5 - Halton Hills town councillor Pete Pomerov announces his intentions to run for mayor.
