The Georgetown Selects showed that they could bounce back with a 9-1 victory over a top Clarkson major atom team.

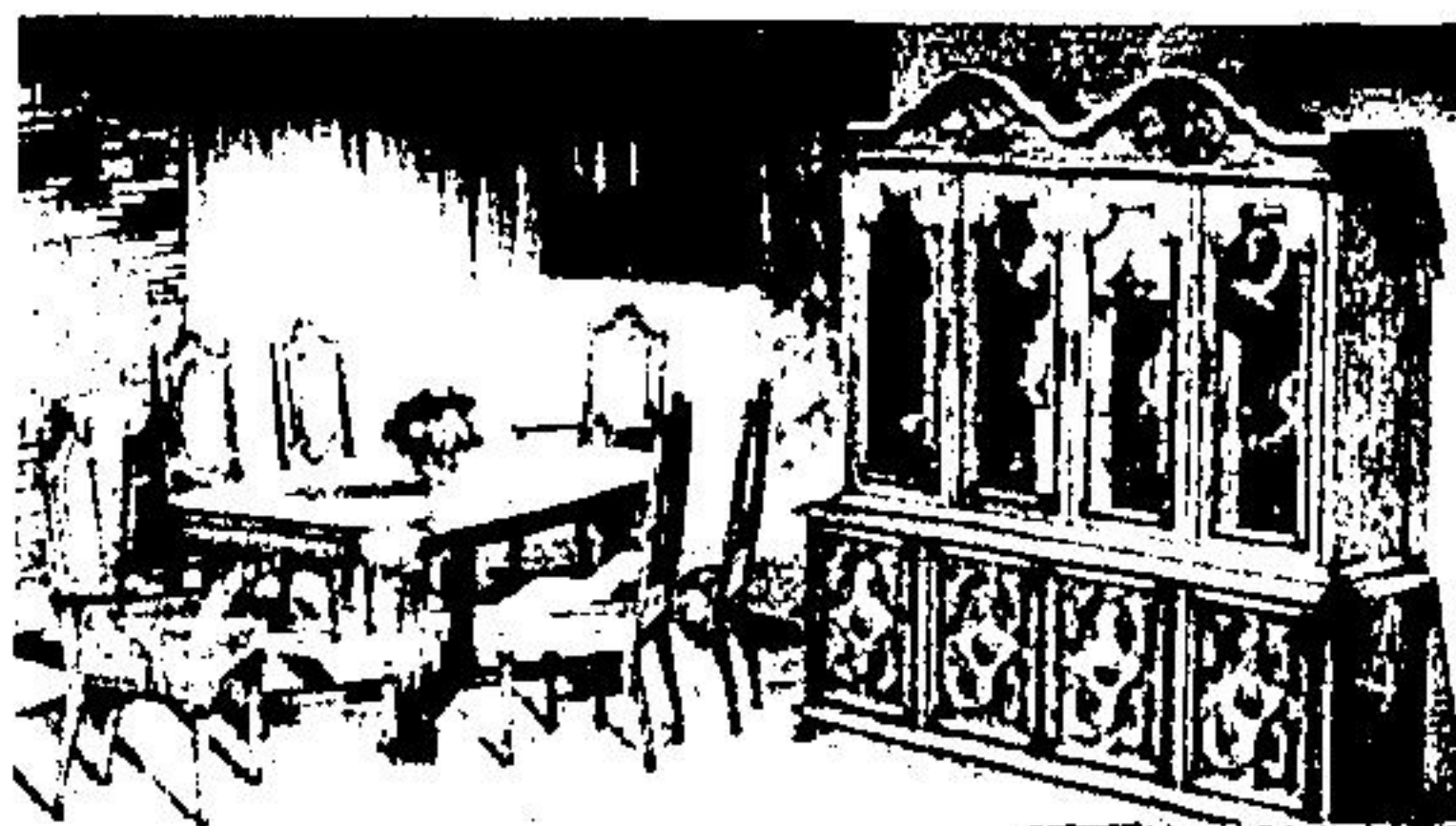
Bob Klavkalns got his hat trick by scoring the first three goals with assists from brother Brad Klavkalns with two and Mike Tyler with two.

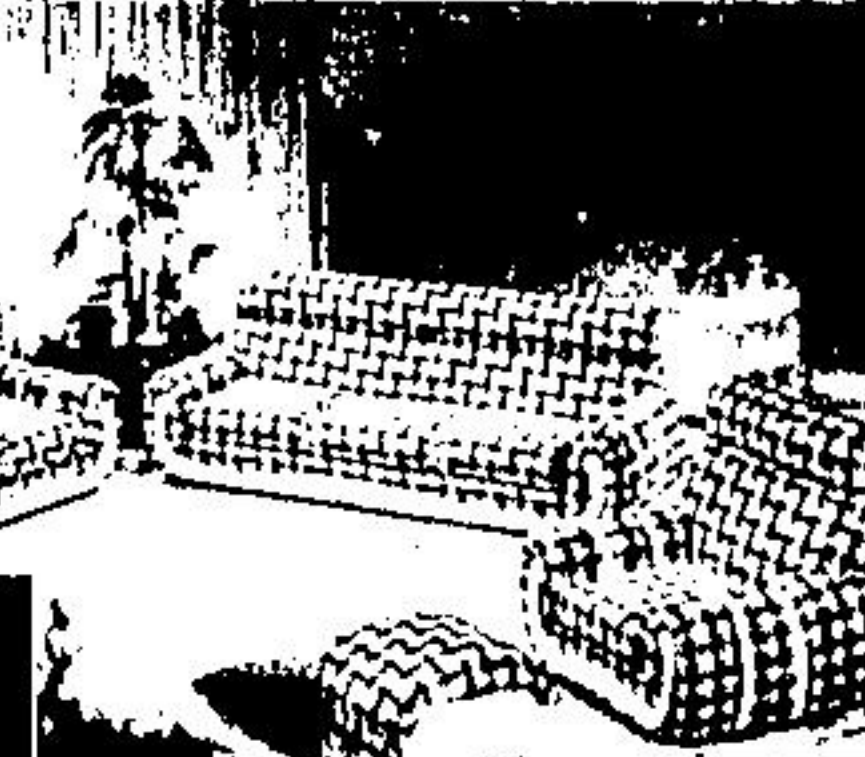
Howard Green played extremely well in the nets.
