

Sabres lose fourteenth in row Brampton scores late goals

The Acton Sabres dropped their fourteenth consecutive game by a 6-4 score Friday night at home against the Brampton Logan Chevys.

In their last 27 games the Sabres have managed to come up with just two victories. The Sabres had a chance to win this one, but Brampton

came up with two goals in the latter part of the third period to take what was for them an important two points.

The Sabres have 10 games left on their schedule and their chances of now earning a playoff spot are next to nil. They trail the eighth-place Barrie Colts by 12 points.

With approximately five minutes to go in the frame Brad Buchanan scored by Ryan and Paul Henderson and the score was tied.

Rybka, a Sabre killer this night, completed his hat trick early in the third and Acton was behind again.

The Sabres bounced back again when Murray scored from Matt Lambert and Kelly Shaw at the 7:44 mark of the period.

Only 20 seconds later Scott Wright potted the winner for Brampton.

Rick Hamm tallied an insurance marker with 3:44 remaining to be played.

Rob Bremner was again guarding the net for the Sabres. He was busy as he stopped 43 shots. Greg Lever stopped 38 at the other end of the rink.

The Sabres were very strong in the second period as they outshot Brampton 19-5 in that frame.

Last Tuesday the Sabres faced their former teammate Paul Pickard and the Streetsville Derbys. The Derbys won 11-2.

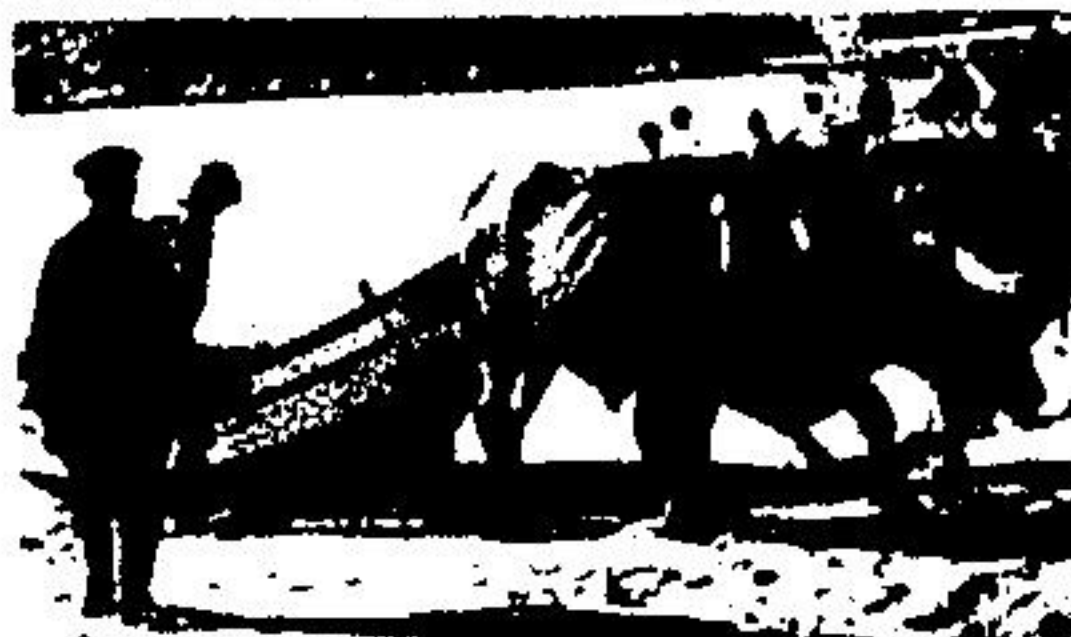
