

Senior cagers split two games

The G.D.H.S. Senior boys basketball Rebels split a home and home encounter with White Oaks High last week as they dropped a 57-43 decision at White Oaks and won at home by a narrow 54-52 score.

On the White Oaks boards, the Rebs started out slowly with missed shots and weak press breaking and allowed White Oaks to forge ahead to a 14-5 lead at the end of the first quarter. The mistakes led to frustration and an obviously uptight Georgetown squad saw the White Oaks lead grow to 30-17 by halftime.

COLLECTED THEMSELVES
The halftime rest allowed the Rebs to collect themselves and the third quarter was quite exciting as the Rebs pulled to within five points on two occasions.

White Oaks did not let down however and kept getting key baskets when they needed them, to come up with the win.

Jim Findlay was outstanding for White Oaks netting 27 points for the afternoon.

On the Reb side, Gord Miller hit for 11 while John Karolidis had seven and Norm Ibuki hit six. Steve Keslick was the top Reb rebounder.

"Keslick was effective in controlling Findlay last year but Jim was not to be denied this time," Reb coach Moe Leeking stated in a post game interview. Leeking went on to say, "Rob Rivers played a good game for us filling in for starting guard Rick Fisher who was nursing a sprained ankle."

"Mark Nelstrop and Kevin Neill filled in admirably when they were put in, so, on the whole I was pleased with our general performance if not the outcome," coach Leeking concluded.

In the second game of the Reb home boards, the boys came out flying and showed glimpses of brilliance taking

the lead from the start and never losing it.

With 3:32 left in the first half the Rebs were ahead 26-6 and the emotions of White Oaks, particularly those of their coach, broke open to the point where chairs were being kicked. A White Oaks time out didn't even help as the Rebs kept sticking it to them and at half-time the Rebs went into the dressing room with a 32-15 lead.

OVER CONFIDENT
When the second half started, the Rebs seemed a little over confident and their defence, strong in the first half, began to weaken.

By the third quarter White Oaks had fought back to within nine points with just over two minutes left.

White Oaks continued the pressure into the fourth quarter and the outcome was in

doubt right up to the very exciting finish.

An obviously excited coach Leeking said, "It was a much, much better game than last Wednesday and the boys executed plays with more assurance, particularly in the first half. We seemed up for the game and although we made a couple of silly mistakes in the fourth quarter, the boys kept their cool."

Scoring for the Rebs was pretty even with John Karolidis and Miller netting 14 each while Bill Rivers hit the twine for 11.

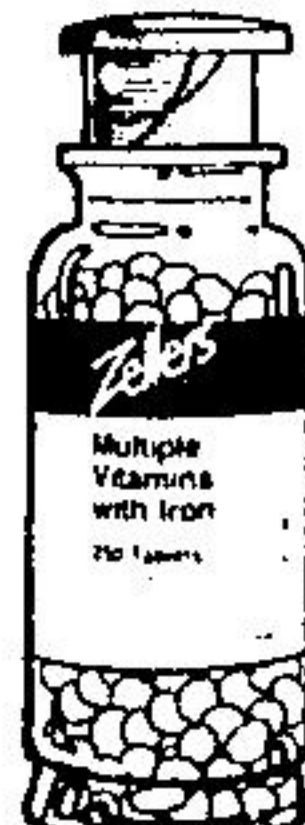

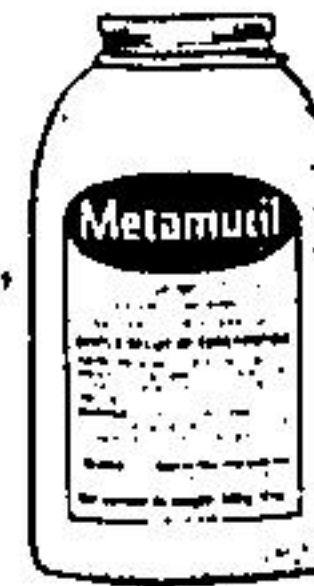
