

### Agricultural Report

**Halton Soil & Crop Improvement Association Annual**

On Wednesday, January 10th Halton Soil and Crop Improvement Association members met at the Hillcrest United Church for their annual meeting. Guest speaker Dr. Murray Johnson, Chairman of the Canadian section of PLUARG, discussed the co-operation between Canada and the United States in attempting to reduce pollution of the Great Lakes. Murray stated that 2400 metric tonnes per year excess phosphorus is being deposited in the Great Lakes. Close to one-half of this comes from agricultural land mainly as a result of erosion of soil particles in the water system. Heavy industrialized areas can have many times more phosphorus run off than agricultural. They also contribute a lot of heavy metals to our water system. Murray strongly suggested buffer strips of grass along drains, strip cropping or planting our grain and corn across the slope in bands alternating them with sod. He also suggested that farmers should be compensated for incurring the extra cost of reducing phosphorus in our streams.

**PAST PRESIDENT**  
George Gardhouse, Caledon East 4, the Past President of the Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association, suggested other means of controlling phosphorus in streams from a farmer's point of view - using crop rotations to get more grass and forages on our hills to cut down erosion, improved handling of our manure to keep it from washing into the streams using the Capital Grand program available to farmers for erosion control practices, fencing all waterways and improve manure handling facilities.

Henry Ediger, General Manager of the Crop Insurance of Ontario, stated that 40 per cent of Halton's corn acreage, 17 per cent of the spring grain acreage and 33 per cent of the winter wheat acreage is insured. In 1978 Halton producers had 57 claims for crop insurance with the Crop Insurance Commission paying out close to three times as much money as they received for Halton. This was due to the very dry June and July. Mr. Ediger stated that two extra inches of rain in July would have saved the Crop Insurance Commission at least 6 million dollars. Despite the poor yields in this part of the province and parts of Eastern Ontario, the Commission still has 3 million dollars surplus for the year.

Paul Fish, Soils and Crops Specialist, presented the annual summary of projects. Prize money for the High Yield Competitions were awarded as follows: Grain Corn - 1st, Art Lawson, Milton 5 (114 bu. acre); 2nd, Harvey Nurse, Georgetown 2 (113 bu.-acre); Spring Grain - 1st, Murray Harris, Milton 8 (2746 pounds-acre); 2nd, Keith Aitken, Acton 3 (2592 pounds-acre) Corn Silage - 1st, Jim Reid, Georgetown 2.

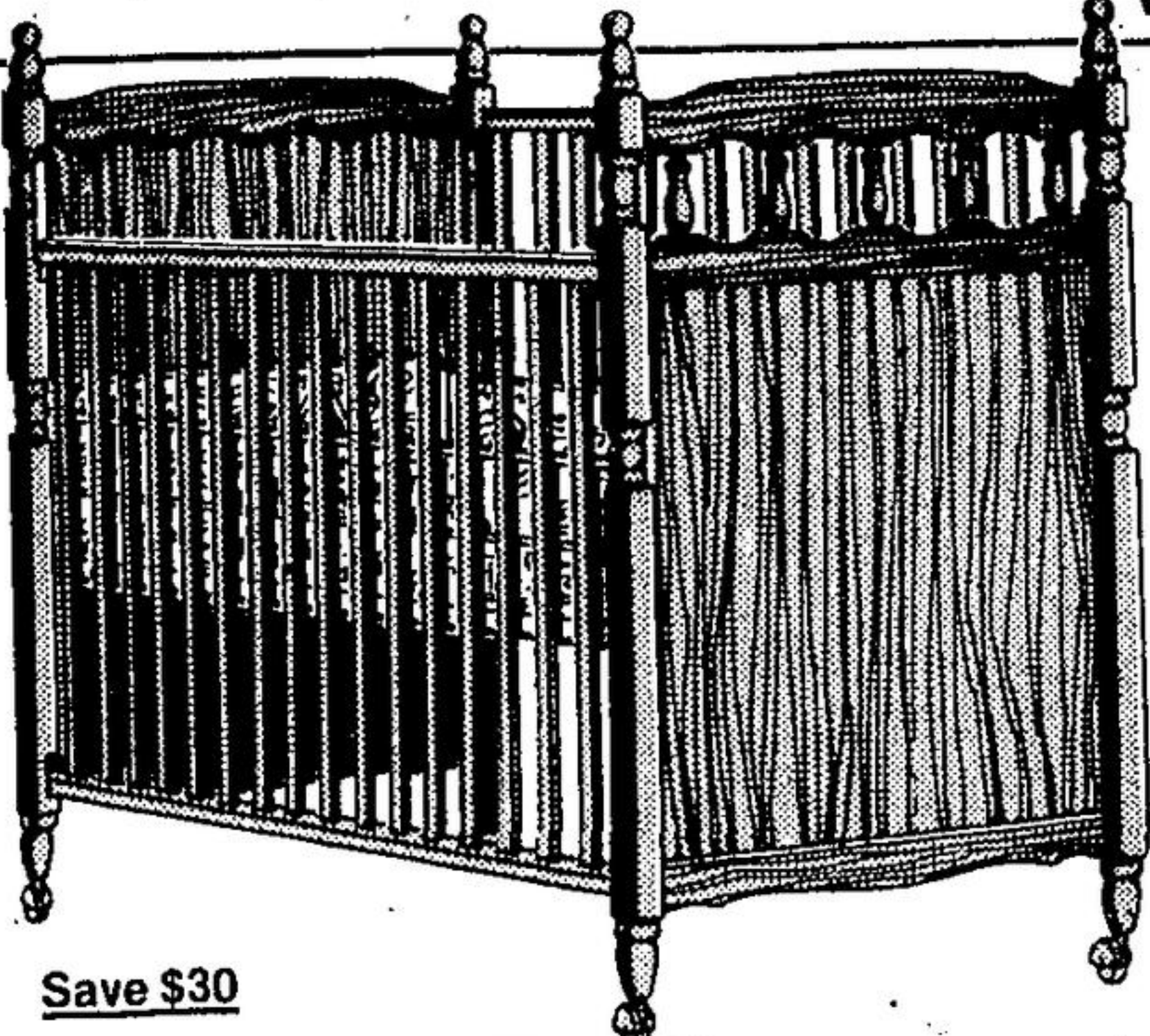
Larry Hoard and Tom Wilson are to represent Halton in the Junior Team Competition at the International Plowing Match this year.
