

Sports Flashback: Raiders to sign two players

Georgetown Raiders proved a point in front of over 900 fans at Memorial Arena Friday night as they whipped the Dundas Merchants 3-0. Dundas had been the league's hot team and were threatening to dethrone the defending provincial champion Raiders.

The Raiders goals were scored by Jeff Nicholson, Tom Gilbert and Bill Currie. They scored in each period.

The shutout was earned by Keith Pallett, who had plenty of help from blueliners Currie, Neil Cotton, Dave McMenemy and John Boyce.

Rumor has it that the Raiders will have a couple of new faces in the lineup this week with Big Gord Thompson and Tim McNeil both ready to sign.

From the February 6, 1969 issue of The Herald:

The GDHS senior basketball team has completed its schedule and is now readying for the playoffs. The team beat Guelph CVI 31-28 in its last game. Leading the way offensively were Dave DeSylva, Nigel Gunding and Freddie Harris with the backcourt being led by Hughie Williams.

And from the same issue. The Junior Raiders contin-

ued to slump and are now in sixth place with 12 wins, 14 losses and five ties record. They are tied for sixth with Richmond Hill in the 10-team league with Milton, Lindsay and Newmarket battling it out for the top spot.

Georgetown took its worst beating of the season Thursday as Newmarket bombed them 12-3.

The leading scorers for Georgetown are Kemshead, Hay, King, McMullen, Nash

and Dwyer. Kemshead has scored 26 goals.
