Reject Esquering landowners request

Time and money constraints have led Halton region's planning committee to deny a request from the South Esquering Landowner's Association to have copies of planning department documents forwarded to its executive members.

In a letter to committee chairman Roy Booth of Halton Hills, RR3 Georgetown farmer Rod Pinkney requested on the Association's behalf extensive documentation "to facilitate our preparation of formal objections to the Halton region official plan."

Mr. Pinkney attended last Tuesday's committee meeting to affirm his request for a list of all subdivisions approved by the region since its formation in 1974, giving the location and acreage of each, a copy of a regional report on the agricultural classification or viability of soils and reasons why the lands involved should be subdivided, and a list of all applications for lot separations that have been refused by the region. He asked for five or six copies of the regional plan in addition.

FIVE YEARS

The official plan, five years in the making, was approved by regional council Sept. 6, despite objections filed at the time by Mr. Pinkney and other concerned residents. The plan is now awaiting final approval by the provincial ministry of housing.

Prior to the committee meeting last week, Coun. Booth, wrote to Mr. Pinkney thanking him for his interest but warning that the committee might reject his request because of the dangerous precedent it could set in terms of staff time and reproduction costs.

"There could also be some misinterpretation regarding the agricultural classification or soil viability portion of your letter," Coun. Booth wrote. He suggested that Mr. Pinkney should attend the committee meeting to discuss the meeting with councillors.

At the meeting, assistant clerk Bill McCreary agreed with Coun. Booth's appraisal of the request, commenting that approval could set "a bad precedent" since the region's clerical staff do not have sufficient time to prepare copies of such extensive documentation.

USED MAPS

Bob White of the regional planning department pointed out that agricultural capability maps similar to those used by the provincial government are available which could meet some of the Landowner's Association's needs. Mr. Pinkney complained that the maps are inaccurate, however, and stood by his initial request.

Although he maintained that the Association should not have to cover the cost of having regional staff prepare copies of the information, Mr. Pinkney was advised that the Ontario Municipal Act requires some financial contribution from members of the public seeking copies of official documents.

Coun. Booth quoted the Act's stipulations that any person must be afforded free access to municipal records, but if copies are to be furnished, that person must pay the clerk a rate of 10 cents per every 100 words, or an alternative rate as set by council.

Mr. Pinkney was assured that he could visit the clerk's office and personally examine any municipal records. He expressed his willingness to pay for any copies of documents that may subsequently be needed.

Lawyer apologizes to police

The Halton Regional Police Commission has received a letter of apology from Halton lawyer Peter McWilliams directed towards Constable Douglas Booth.

Constable Booth was involved in a complaint by Oakville resident Murray Norris that Halton Regional Police officers used unnecessary force when they raided a party in September. Mr. Norris said he needed several stitches to close wounds he received after being beaten with a billy club.

As a result of a Supreme Court hearing into the case, Constable Booth was cleared, and Mr. McWilliams in a letter to the commission, apologized for any embarrassment or any other problems he may have caused Constable Booth.

While there was a long list of names at the bottom of the letter indicating who would be receiving copies, Constable Booth's name was not among them, and the commission voted to send him a copy of the letter.
