

Gymnasts win laurels

Local girls performed well in the North York Turners Invitational Gymnastics Meet in North York on Saturday, January 21.

Six young gymnasts from the Saturday morning classes conducted by the Halton Hills Recreation Department competed in Category B, designed for gymnasts who practice less than eight hours each week. Because of limited facilities in Acton, these local girls are usually able to practice only one and a half hours each week.

Ontario Outdoors

Are you heading out cross country skiing or possibly snowshoeing? Maybe only ice fishing? Then why not take along some bannock mix. For a change try adding spice to the flour mix when making the bannock and you will end up with a kind of spice bread. This is my own idea, so try it out for yourself before depending on it on the trail or at some distant camp site.

However, I think you will like the change. I know that I do, and following is a recipe for this new bread. This basic mix can be prepared and stored in plastic bags and will last about five days.

Simply multiply the mix by the number of persons in the party, and the number of days on the trail or at camp. 1 cup all purpose flour, to which add 1/4 teaspoon salt, and either of the following: 1/4 tsp. ginger, nutmeg, cinnamon,
