or allspice. Another alternative is to use garlic salt or onion salt in place of the regular salt in the recipe.

Then add 1 tsp. baking powder and 2 tblsp. of powdered milk. When cooking the bread, oil or grease the skillet and let it warm, add enough cold water to the above mix to make a soft dough, and knead into the desired shape of cake. It should be about an inch thick to cook through.

Place in pan and set over fire till it browns on bottom, then turn it over. This time place the skillet so the heat of the fire gets to the top, in other words prop it up facing the flames. It should take about 15 minutes in the summer and 20 in the winter. The old method of winding the bannock mix around green stick will work well.
