Ian Syme tallied the only goal of the first period to put Norval in the lead.


Jim Blair got that goal back for Way-Jay as he counted the only score of the second period.

Norval has a solid lock on first place and Philp has just about wrapped up second, but the remaining placings in the standings are all up for grabs.




