**Does the library still lend books?**

Has the Halton Hills Public Library Board forgotten that a library is essentially designed to be a place where people can borrow books? Apparently, according to Coun. Roy Booth. Coun. Booth insisted he was not being facetious when he introduced a motion at council's Monday night meeting that pointed out an oversight in the library board's stated goals and objectives for future library facilities in Georgetown, as outlined in the minutes of the Jan. 17 board meeting. There were a few chuckles around the council table as Coun. Booth's motion was passed, calling upon the board to give "strong consideration to making reference in its goals and objectives to the practice of lending books, both fact and fiction, to members of the public." "Maybe they've gotten a little off track," Coun. Booth suggested. Among the goals considered by the board Jan. 17 were the provision of information, the development of library services "to stimulate individual interests, raise personal awareness and broaden personal experience," the co-ordination of local information service groups, the provision of physical facilities and resource staff to administer library services and the development of "policies and mechanisms to permit the library to be responsive to the changing, intellectual, cultural, creative and information needs of the community."

**Wage hike rejected**  
Town council has rejected a recommendation by its general committee that was to have increased part-time wages for summer students hired by the town's recreation and parks department. A five per cent wage increase over 1978 levels for students to be hired this summer by the works and engineering students gained council's approval Monday night, but increases requested by recreation director Glen Gray, amounting to as much as 25 per cent in some cases, were rejected by a 5-4 vote. In the recorded vote, councillors Russ Miller, Marilyn Serjeantson, Harry Levy, Roy Booth and Walter Biehn opposed the suggested increases for recreation wages. Endorsing the request were councillors George Malby, Ross Knechtel, Mike Armstrong and John McDonald. Mayor Pete Pomeroy and councillors Ed Wood, Les Duby and Pat Patterson were absent. Wage increases requested by Mr. Gray ranged from a 15-cent hike for senior canteen workers at the arenas to a \$40 per week jump for summer programme supervisors.
