

Sports Flashback

Taken from the February 22, 1973 issue of The Herald:

The Georgetown Raiders' 7-3 victory over the Port Colborne Sailors means the two teams are now tied for second place in the standings behind the Dundas Merchants.

The Raiders and Sailors now both have records of 18 wins, 16 losses. The Raiders are hot, winning three of their last four games.

Paul Robinson spearheaded the Raiders with three goals and an assist against Port Colborne. Tom Gillis had a goal as he turned out his best performance of the season. Bill Currie and Tom Gilbert notched the other goals.

The game against the Sailors was very clean, but in the game against the Dunnville Mudcats it was a different story.

In a game against the Mudcats the game clock never got passed the 18:52 mark of the first period, because the referees could not control the violence.

The fighting in that game started when Ray Inglis traded punches with Dunnville's George Maxwell. Players from both benches poured over the boards to join the melee.

When the smoke had clear-

ed Raiders Neil Cotton, Blake Inglis and Bob Bingham as well as the Mudcat's Keith Austin, Wayne Schweyer, Bill Barnell and Tom Bowker all received game suspensions.

One of the Mudcats combatants was knocked unconscious and had to be taken to the arena medical room for attention. He was not seriously injured.

Redmen win 55-50

In a double header basketball game on January 31, the Acton high school Junior Redmen defeated Queen Elizabeth Park (QEP) 55-50. The Midget Redmen went down to QEP 51-36.

In the fast paced junior game, the first quarter was deceptive, with QEP outshooting Acton 11 to six.

By the second quarter, the Redmen were hitting their mark, scoring only one point less than the visiting team, although QEP was still leading 26-22.

After halftime, Acton gathered momentum and took the lead away from QEP, netting 16 points, seven more than their competitor. The score was now 38-35 for Acton.

Both teams came up fighting in the final quarter, with control of the game switching from one team back to the other. After two of QEP's players were fouled out of the game, Acton took the lead and held on to it until the final buzzer, winning by a score of 55-50.

Top scorers for Acton were Martin Osso with 19 points, Glen Van Rijk with 10, and Bob McClure with nine.

The midget Redmen did not have one of their best games, going down to defeat 51-36 at the hands of QEP.

The first quarter was an indication of how the rest of the game would go, with QEP netting 15, while Acton managed only eight points.

The second quarter proved much better for Acton, with the home team scoring 12 points to the visitors 16.

Although Acton was catching up, QEP was still in the lead 31-20.

Neither team could get their shots through the hoop during the third quarter, QEP managing only eight points, and Acton trailing slightly behind with five.

During the final quarter, Acton and QEP stayed neck in neck in the number of points each netted, although Acton could not catch up with the lead QEP had earned itself early in the game.

High point scorers for the midget Redmen were Joe Lobelio with 13 points, and John Lobelio with eight.
