



1947/48 Raiders first to province title for George

The year was 1948. The month was April. The day was Friday and it belonged to the Georgetown Raiders as they captured the OHA Intermediate "A" championship.

Garfield McGilvray was The Herald scribe in those days and here is part of the story he filed.

.. With hundreds of their supporters on hand at the Vabrudt test snork sweden night, the Georgetown Raiders captured the inchampionship by defeating the Marknam Millionaires 4-3 in an overtime session in the fifth game of the play-off series.

.... While the Georgetown Hockey Club has had an enviable record in booksy circles down through the years, the victory of this year's team has solidly set the name of Georgetown in the records for all time to come. The feam deserves all the praise and congratulations they are receiving for a great display of hockey throughout the entire season, and if there be still greater laurels to be fought for. we can count on these boys

.. This is the first OHA title a Georgetown team has held since the Arens was built in 1723, and with the series won the fans went wild with excitement. The Girls Pipe Band were on hand with their music and when the special train and the team returned home paraded to the four carners of the Main Street where Mayor Gibbons officially congratulated the team on behalf of the town.
