Acton cagers win tourney at Sudbury

The Acton High School Junior Redmen defeated two-time Quebec provincial champions, Amos High School, 50-47, in a tournament over the weekend.

The Redmen then went on to win the Golden Hoop Invitational Tournament, held in Sudbury. They defeated host team Lo-Ellen 66-49, and Timmins High School 57-36.

The Redmen had the most trouble with Amos High School, with the point spread remaining close throughout the game. Acton was winning the game 48-47 with three seconds of play left, when the Amos team fouled them.

Martin Osso stepped to the foul line and netted two baskets to make the final score 50-47 in favor of Acton.

High scorers for Acton were Martin Osso with 18, Glen Van Rijk with 13, Rob

Faber with six, and Chris Lysholm also with six points.

The Redmen had no trouble defeating Lo-Ellen High School, 66-49. Top point getters for the Redmen in their second game were Osso with 18, Van Rijk and Ted Nadhazi with 12 each, and Bob McClure with 10.

In the finals, Acton faced Timmins, who proved to be a tough opponent during the first half of the game. At the end of the first quarter, the score was 10-2 for Timmins. It was not until halftime that Acton got into the game, and stole it handily, 57-36 from Timmins. Osso scored 27 points in the second half of the game to help put the Redmen ahead 57-36. Nadhazi played well defensively.

Osso was named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament, and Nadhazi was named to the all-star team, along with Osso.

Businessmen asked to back Canadian formula car racer

A formula Atlantic racing car was the surprise attraction Monday evening when Georgetown and area businessmen were invited to hear how they could become backers of a Canadian racer.

Alec Donachy, assistant manager of the North Halton Golf and Country Club, told those present he has purchas-

ed the \$22,000 car from a driver who used it in the racing circuit last year and plans to race in eight of the 11 North American Formula Atlantic races scheduled for 1979.

Donachy said he has had three years of racing experience in Europe and plans to

return to England in March to compete in four or five races to help prepare for the Formula Atlantic events scheduled later in the year.

Although he is looking for sponsors to help meet the cost of his racing Mr. Donachy outlined plans to use the car as part of a promotional display at various events. He said he is negotiating with several companies including the Bumper to Bumper division of Acklands for the use of his car. He also expected commercial sponsors to pick up the approximately \$7,500 expenses involved in each race.

Donachy indicated that he is looking for "no more than \$15,000" from local sponsors who will buy shares on a debenture basis in an incorporated company he proposes to form to look after the racing venture.

In addition to the 1978 car which was delivered to him on Monday he hopes to buy another engine and develop a professional approach for potential sponsors. He said that the car will be insured well so that it can be kept in excellent condition and thus re-sold at the end of the season.

Barber and Johnson will skate in carnival
