

# Boys gymnastics team test flexibility in meet

The G.D.H.S. Boys Gymnastics team tested their flexibility as they competed in their first tournament of the season at Oakville Trafalgar

High earlier this week. There were five other schools in the tournament, M.M. Robinson, Erindale, Chinguacousy, Highlands,

and the host team Oakville Trafalgar. "Highlands High School from Dundas gave us a les-

son in gymnastics. They're ranked in the top 10 of Ontario schools," coach Kotani stated.

Seniors Dave Bootle and David Deere finished one, two in the vault with Bootle achieving an 9.0 mark and Deere a 8.8 mark.

Deere also swung to a second on the rings with an 8.3 mark and accomplished a third on the parallel bars with a 7.1 mark.

Bootle, who is only a first year senior with two years left, is showing tremendous skills against competitors that are on the average older than he is by also tumbling to a third in the floor competition with a mark of 8.3.

The gymnasts that make up the junior squad for the rebel team are Brandon Ferguson, Mike Pearce, Dave Aiberley, Duane Wilson, who are all grade nine students

and Mike Harding and Jamie Burt who are grade 10 students.

"I was quite pleased with the juniors performances and I can see large improvements in their ability since we started training this year," Kotani said.

Two other first year seniors, George Farrow and Pete Morris, also fared well.

"These two boys (Farrow and Morris) are really coming on, it is their first year on the team and they have two years left," Kotani concluded.

The two members who complete this year's roster for the Rebels are John Thorpe and Herb Kewley who are both first year seniors.

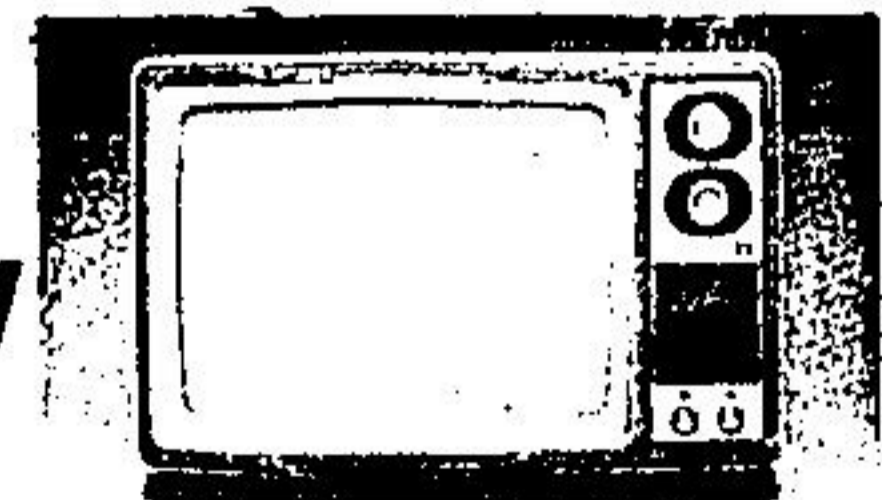
