# Acton juniors bomb Assumption 79-14

In league play the Acton high school junior Redmen basketball team trounced Assumption by a margin of 79-14 here Friday, Overall, the junior Redmen have won 30 games and lost only seven.

Martin Osso led the scoring race for the Redmen, putting 18 points through the hoop. Rob Lenizky nelted 10, Steve Springle nine, and John Vuk added eight to the final score for the Redmen.

The win assured the junior Redmen of fourth place in their league, and with it, a berth in the playoffs. If they win their last two games against T.A. Blakelock and Perdue High Schools, both from Oakville, the Redmen can possibly take control of second place, behind first place Milton.

Acton lost 60-46 against first place Milton in

league action last week. Top scorer for Acton was Osso with 18 points, McClure

and Rob Lenizky picked up eight points each for the Redmen, while Chris Lsyholm netted seven, and Nadhazi six.

"It was a good team effort. We played well, and I really couldn't expect more because Milton is a really good team," said McArthur.

Acion took Thornhill 38-31 in their first game, then went on to defeat Oshawa 40-36. In the final game, Acton faced home team Stayner, and came up victorious 41-31.

Osso led the Redmen offense taking scoring honors for Acton in all three games.

Coach Rick McArthur attributed the wins in the Stayner fournament to the tremendous team effort which the Redmen displayed.

The Redmen lost a close decision to T.A. Blakelock High School, 40-37 on Monday night in Blaketock.

The Acton squad was up by six points until the last three minutes of the game, when the home team pulled ahead by one point. In the final seconds, Blakelock netted another basket to take the game by three.

Osso led Acton on offense with 17 points. McClure netted eight for the Redmen, while Red Nadhazi and Rob Faber swished two each.

If the Redmen win today (Wednesday) against Perdue, in Acton, they will be in a three way tie for second place with Blakelock and Perdue. The league will draw from a hal to determine which team will get second place if that happens.

Coach McArthur is hoping for a win today because, although a loss will not put them out of the playoffs, a loss will make Milton their opponent in the first round of playoffs.
