

DeBoer's defaults big game

The DeBoer's Movers had an apparent 8-5 victory over Caledon Chiefs in GIHL action Sunday, but after it was over they had to forfeit the win because Don Richards, a player under suspension, played.

Richards had received a two-game suspension the previous week for a high-sticking infraction. However, league statistician Ron Copland forgot to record and inform DeBoer's of the suspension.

"The managers of each team know that high-sticking penalties carry suspensions," Copland said. "Although I forgot to inform them they should have known not to dress him."

League president Wayne King decided to award the win to the Chiefs on the basis that DeBoer's should not have dressed Richards. The fact that DeBoer's was not officially informed of the suspension was irrelevant, King ruled.

Copland said he takes full blame for the lack of communication, but that a precedent had been set last year in regard to using suspended players and it could not be changed.

Richards actually did not figure very heavily in the decision as he only had two assists.

HAT TRICK

Doug Pembleton was the big scorer for the Movers as he scored a hat trick. Rick Becker had two with singles going to Ray Peacock, Doug Hills and Doug Barnes. Bob Inglis had four assists.

Keith Aubrey and Rick Rodgers had two goals each

for the Chiefs with a single going to Ernie Schaump.

The other two games were routs as Philp Publishing handed United Rental 8-2 and Norval thumped Way-Jay 13-2.

Ron Blizzard had a field day for Philp as he scored four times and also added three assists.

Bob Osborne had two goals and three assists with the other markers going to Nick Belviso and Vince Micallef.

Rob Harrison had both the markers for Rental who are in a horrible slump.

Brian Beaumont and Dave Holmes, the league's two leading scorers, had an excellent day for Norval.

Beaumont scored three times and added an assist while Holmes also had three and added three assists.

Charlie Knoepfli and Doug Anderson had two goals each with the former getting four assists.

Other scorers were Blake Inglis, Ray Inglis and Larry Peterson. Blake Inglis had three assists and Ian Syme helped set up four.

Grant and Greg Bodnar scored the Way-Jay goals.

The loss by DeBoer's was very important as it left them in a fifth place tie with Rental. The two points would have put them in a tie with Way-Jay for the fourth and final playoff spot. As it stands now they will be very hard pressed to get into the playoffs.
