# McCorry a winner

Julie McCorry last Sunday qualified for the provincial Y.B.C. finals by defeating 14 of the best bantam bowlers in Central Ontario.

After her first game of 184, Julie was in second place, nine pins behind the leader. In the second game, the going became tough with three corner pins, a headpin and a split but she managed a score of 159 to pull a few pins ahead of the leader who also had problems.

However in the third game with the loud vocal support of her Saturday bowling pals, she quickly pulled ahead beyond reach of the other contestants. With five strikes in a row and another strike she had a game of 278. This gave Julie a triple of 621 and a tip to the provincials on March 18 to join the junior boys team who qualified the week before.

Bantam Brent Osatchuk would have been in the top three but a few fouls dropped him out of contention even though he bowled a 235 in his final game with his never "give-up" spirit. The junior and senior competitors bowled well but as happens in a

three game set they needed that "one big game" to win.

This Saturday, Mar. 3 there will be no youth bowling as the Canadian legion will be having their Southern Ontario championships with winners going on to the provincials in Sudbury. The Georgetown representatives, the zone winners, will be Joe Foster and Phillip Southon.

Sunday at the zone round at "G.B." of the presidents, secretaries and treasurers tournament, the winning president was John Reaume Jr. (Tues. Nilers) who bowled 128 pins over average with Aileen Armstrong, (D.R.G.), 2nd with 88 pins over average. For the secretaries Joan Archibald (Carlwin) had 124 pins over average with Dorothy Brandford (Golden Age) second with 45. The treasurers were lead by Anne Nicholson (Carlwin) with 139 and Gloria Hamilton (Domtar) with 18.

At the Daytime Ladies Provincials the ladies team from Georgetown held on in the top three for two games but could not put it together in the third game.
