

Beaumont wins G.I.H.L. scoring title

The Georgetown Industrial Hockey League regular season came to an end Sunday with Norval defeating DeBoer's Movers 11-6, Philp Publishing dumping United Rental 7-1 and the Caledon Chiefs edging Way-Jay 3-1.

The playoffs will get under way this coming Sunday with Philp taking on the Chiefs at 9:15 a.m. and Way-Jay meeting Norval at 10:45.

Norval and Philp will go into the series the overwhelming favorites. However, both their opponents have the capabilities of pulling off a major upset.

SLOW START

The Chiefs, who started the season very slowly, have been snowballing and are peaking for the playoffs. They are a sound all-around squad and they could give Philp trouble.

Way-Jay has an unimpressive record and it would be an amazing upset if they knock off Norval, a team that has lost only once this season.

Way-Jay does have a lot of individual talent in the lineup and although it is not very likely, there is still a chance they can defeat Norval.

Both the series should be very entertaining.

If Philp and Norval both get by the semi-finals, the final should be very memorable. The two teams have had very tight games throughout the season. Norval's one loss was suffered against Philp.

Brian Beaumont, the league's perennial scoring champion pulled off the trick again this year.

Beaumont and teammate Dave Holmes went into the final game separated by just three points and Beaumont expanded the margin to five after an excellent outing against DeBoer's.

Beaumont scored five goals and added a couple of assists. Holmes did not do too badly either scoring a goal and adding four assists.

Doug Anderson and Ian Syme, the third and fourth leading scorers, both had two goals. Syme also picked up five assists.

The other Norval goal went to captain Ray Inglis, who also had three assists.

Ray Peacock was the big gun for DeBoer's as he scored four goals and also added an assist.

The other two goals were recorded by Doug Hills. Don Richards had three assists.

BLIZZARD

Ron Blizzard led the attack for Philp in their win as he scored a hat trick and also had an assist.

Bob Osborne was also a dominant figure scoring

twice adding three assists.

The other Philp goals went to Louis D'Orazio, and Scott McLaughlin. Kevin Brown had a couple of assists.

Dan Boland on a play set up by Chris Broadbent, was the only Rental player to tally.

The Chiefs-Way-Jay game was a very tight one.

The Chiefs took the lead early when Ernie Schaump connected from Ted Hurren and John Thompson.

Before the period was out Max Korzack tied it up for Way-Jay with Greg Bodnar earning an assist.

Only 39 seconds into the second period the Chiefs went ahead again on Kevin Judge's marker from Philp. The same combination connected with the game's last goal late in the final frame.

In the goals-against department it was a very close battle between Norval and Philp.

Rick Tomkinson, who played in 19 of Norval's 20 games, took the title by three goals over Glenn Tost and Ron Osborne of Philp.
