

Mark Reis suspended from Bruins

Georgetown's Mark Reis is no longer a member of the Sheridan College Basketball Bruins.

Bruins coach Dick Ruschliensky said Reid will never play for a Bruin team, of which he is the coach, again.

In a game against St. Clair Reis lost his temper and received a flagrant technical. It was after that episode that Ruschliensky decided to take the drastic on Reis, who has a record of losing his temper.

The Bruins are about to begin the playoffs and Reis was the runaway scoring leader on the squad this year.

In action last week Sheridan, led by Reis, pulled off a major upset as they defeated

Fanshawe, Canada's number two ranked college basketball team, 63-60.

Reis had one of his best outings of the year against Fanshawe as he was flying at both ends of the court. He blocked shots, made a few steals and was a power off both boards.

Reis also led the balanced Bruin scoring as he pumped

home 15 points. Ambrose Campana had 12 points and Jerry Auger was good for 11.

The next game was the one against St. Clair and the Bruins lost 70-64. The Bruins led until late in the game.

Reis was thrown out of the game late in the going. Before he left he had 20 points. Auger was the leading scorer with 22.

Without Reis in the lineup the Bruins still had enough to defeat Niagara 71-63.

Don Gambacort led the way with 18 points and Campana had 14.

The Bruins first-round opponent in the playoffs will be St. Clair.

The Bruins finished the season with 17 wins and 6 losses.

Bill Richmond, of Georgetown, has just successfully completed all the requirements for Level 5 of the National Coaches' Certification Program.

Richmond has joined an elite of 7 coaches in attaining the highest level in the National Coaches' Certification Program.

There are approximately 29,000 coaches in the five levels of the N.C.C.P. The breakdown is as follows: Level 1 - 13,868; Level 2 - 10,624; Level 3 - 3,700; Level 4 - 300 and as previously mentioned Richmond is now one of 70 coaches with a Level 5 certificate.

Richmond is also one of the busiest coaches you will find. He is the coach with both the Oakville Triple "A" minor midget squad, the Georgetown Bantam 4-Town team. Richmond is also the assistant coach with the Sheridan College Hockey Bruins.
