

Raiders start playoffs Saturday at Alcott

The Georgetown Raiders will make their debut in the Intermediate "A" playoffs this Saturday. Game time will be 7:30 p.m. at Alcott Arena and the opposition will be provided by either the Port Colborne Sailors or the Fort Erie Mavericks.

Those two teams began their two out of three series last night in Port Colborne. They will play the second at Fort Erie tomorrow night and if a fifth game is needed it will be back at the Port Friday.

The schedule will be differ-

ent for the Raiders depending on which team survives the preliminary round.

Here is the schedule if Port Colborne wins: second game - Sunday, March 11, 7 p.m. there; third game - Tuesday, March 13, 8 p.m. here; fourth game - Friday, March 16, there; fifth game - Saturday, March 17, 7:30 p.m., here; sixth game - Tuesday, March 20, 8 p.m. there; seventh game - Friday, March 23, 8:30 p.m. here.

If Fort Erie wins the schedule will be: second game - Tuesday, March 13, 8:15 p.m. there; third game -

Friday, March 16, 8:30 p.m. here; fourth game - Sunday, March 18, 7:15 p.m. there; fifth game - Tuesday, March 20, 8 p.m. here; sixth game - Thursday, March 22, 8:15 p.m. there; seventh game - Friday, March 23, 8:30 p.m. here.

Either series would be the first team to reach eight points affairs. So the last three games are if necessary and if an eighth game is needed the date will have to be set.

Raider general manager Jack Handy said the club will not raise admittance prices over those used during the regular season for the first round. The team has not decided yet what the prices will be for the later rounds.

In the other series the Thorold Athletics will face the Dundas Merchants. It gets underway this Friday in Dundas.

Up north Collingwood will play Orangeville and Owen Sound will tackle Port Elgin. Those playoffs have already gotten underway.

"I'm afraid that if a couple of series go the limit there won't be much time for the winner of the league to get ready for the Eastern Canadian finals," Handy said. He also said that the northern playoff series should be over much sooner than those in the south.

Council meeting Sunday

The proposed Georgetown and District Sports Council will meet Sunday and the outline and the group's objectives has been drawn.

The meeting will be at Cedarvale Park and commence at 12 noon.

Alex Tough, who spearheaded the move to form the council, has with the help of others drafted a proposed "constitution" for the group.

The constitution states that the objectives of the Council will be:

1. It shall be to foster the growth of recreation and/or sports within the boundaries (all of Halton Hills).
2. It shall be to recruit the membership into the council, all the recreation and/or sports within the same boundaries.
3. It shall be to support each member group in the quest for more and better facilities and to support each member group in reaching equitable use of facilities.
4. It shall be to assist in the formation of any new recreation and/or sports organization.

The constitution also proposes that representation from each member group be equal and each have one appointed representative.

Membership to the council will be open to all recreation and/or sports organizations and meetings will be on a monthly basis.

This meeting will be the second. The first one was held on November 16, 1978 and there were 15 recreation and sports organizations present.

Tough and the soccer group took steps to form a Sports Council after it seemed there was a great division among the various sports groups in town.

The Sports Council aims to

close the gap between each of the groups and to work together to get things done.

Anyone interested in sports and recreation needs in the town should be at the meeting Sunday.
