## Max Webster packs Way-Jay concerts

The crowds were left screaming for more following the Max Webster-Teaze concerts Sunday at the Way-Jay Club in Norval.

Way-Jay manager Les Poulin said, in something of an understatement, "The audience seemed to be pleased with the show." The fact that ticket sales were responsible for the addition of a second concert in the evening was an indication of the popularity of Max Webster, he added.

The audience for the first concert in the afternoon was estimated at 1,100 people, and the club was still selling standing-room tickets before the end of the opening act.

**CLUB PLANS**

Mr. Poulin said the club has outlined plans for future concerts, but no confirmed dates have been settled on yet. The Long John Baldry concert, originally scheduled for March 18, has been tentatively re-scheduled for April 1, because the club management felt the Max Webster concert was too close.

The Second City Revue, originally planned for March 22, has also tentatively been re-scheduled to March 29.

There are tentative plans for a concert with Goddo, Bob Segarini, and as-yet-unnamed third band on Good Friday, April 13.

Mr. Poulin said that in order for the events to be well planned and well publicized so that people know they are happening, they have to be spread out a little more than had been thought at first.

As a switch from the regular weekend fare of concerts, the Way-Jay will be offering the first annual Way-Jay Arts and Crafts Show, featuring ceramics, paintings and crafts by Canadian artists on April 14 and 15.

## No true national political party?

The three major political parties miss the fact there is no true national party in Canada, says David Moulton, NDP federal candidate for Brampton-Georgetown.

The New Democrats, Progressive Conservatives, and Liberals, all have problem areas where they have little or no support. But, he said, he is confident the NDP will do well in the upcoming election.

Moulton, who spoke to the Brampton provincial riding NDP association's annual meeting, was acclaimed as riding president at Tuesday night's meeting in the United Auto Workers Hall on Beech Street. The entire executive was acclaimed to office.

**BACK NDP**

Moulton said the group labor in the area will back the NDP during the upcoming election. He said the election issues will deal with the economy specifically with upgrading and enhancing manufacturing capabilities.

Workers must be provided for in the future. This can only be done by controlling the economy directly and through active and supportive government planning, he said.

"People are worried about the economy," he told the audience. "They are worried about their jobs, they are worried about jobs for their kids too."

Moulton says the NDP does not have all the answers, but NDP proposals make more sense than anything the Conservatives or Liberals have in offer.

**ONE PROMISE**

"I don't believe the Canadian people are going to allow themselves to be promised through another election campaign," he said Tuesday. "We all know that whatever the promise, the cost of that promise is going to eventually come out of our pockets."

He says the NDP is only making one promise and the party knows it can keep it.

"We promise to bring the Canadian people better government and we know we can do it because we could do no worse - unless of course Jim Clark and his shadow boxing cabinet actually become a government reality," he said.
