

GDHS gymnasts take title

The GDHS girls gymnastics team captured a Rebel invitational tournament earlier this week, as they tumbled to a convincing team total of 101 points over second place Guelph High, who had 67 team points.

The Rebels were led by Robin Montgomery, Katherine Aggiss and Roberta Burke.

Montgomery was victorious in the senior girls competition as she recorded an individual total of 29.80 points.

The girls competed in four events, the vault, bars, beam and floor routines.

Katherine Aggiss, another Rebel first place finisher, showed her flexibility as she accumulated a total of 29.35 points in the intermediate girls competition.

Roberta Burke was the final Rebel first place champion as she accounted for 29.55 of Georgetown's team points in the Junior girls category.

"It was just basically a warm-up meet. We won but we still have a lot of work to do," Coach Ruth Armstrong said.

The two other schools in the meet were Banting High School and Acton High School.

Acton gymnasts put forth a good showing, with T. Renton recording a first in the novice girls competition with 29.85 points.

Barb Wilson, another top Redmen gymnast, came a

strong second in the junior girls listing with 26.7 points.

Acton was narrowly edged out of third place as Banting High managed 38 points to Acton's 37 points.

Competing on Saturday at the second regional qualifying meet in Mississauga in the Junior B division, McGowan captured a third

place medal for all-round competition.

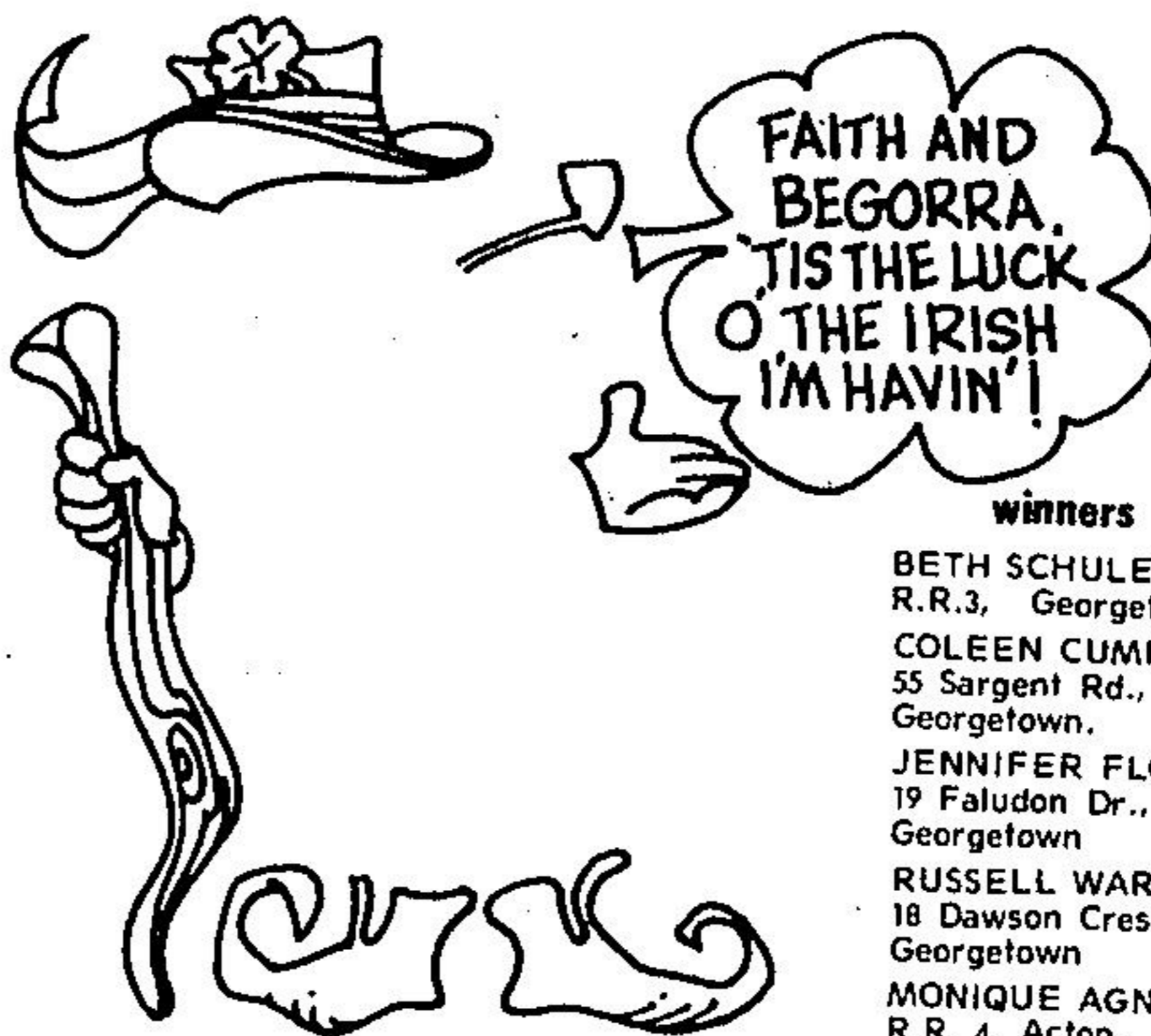
