According to Harry Levy, the Selects played some of their best hockey ever, and their victory over Streetsville was one of the highlights of the season.

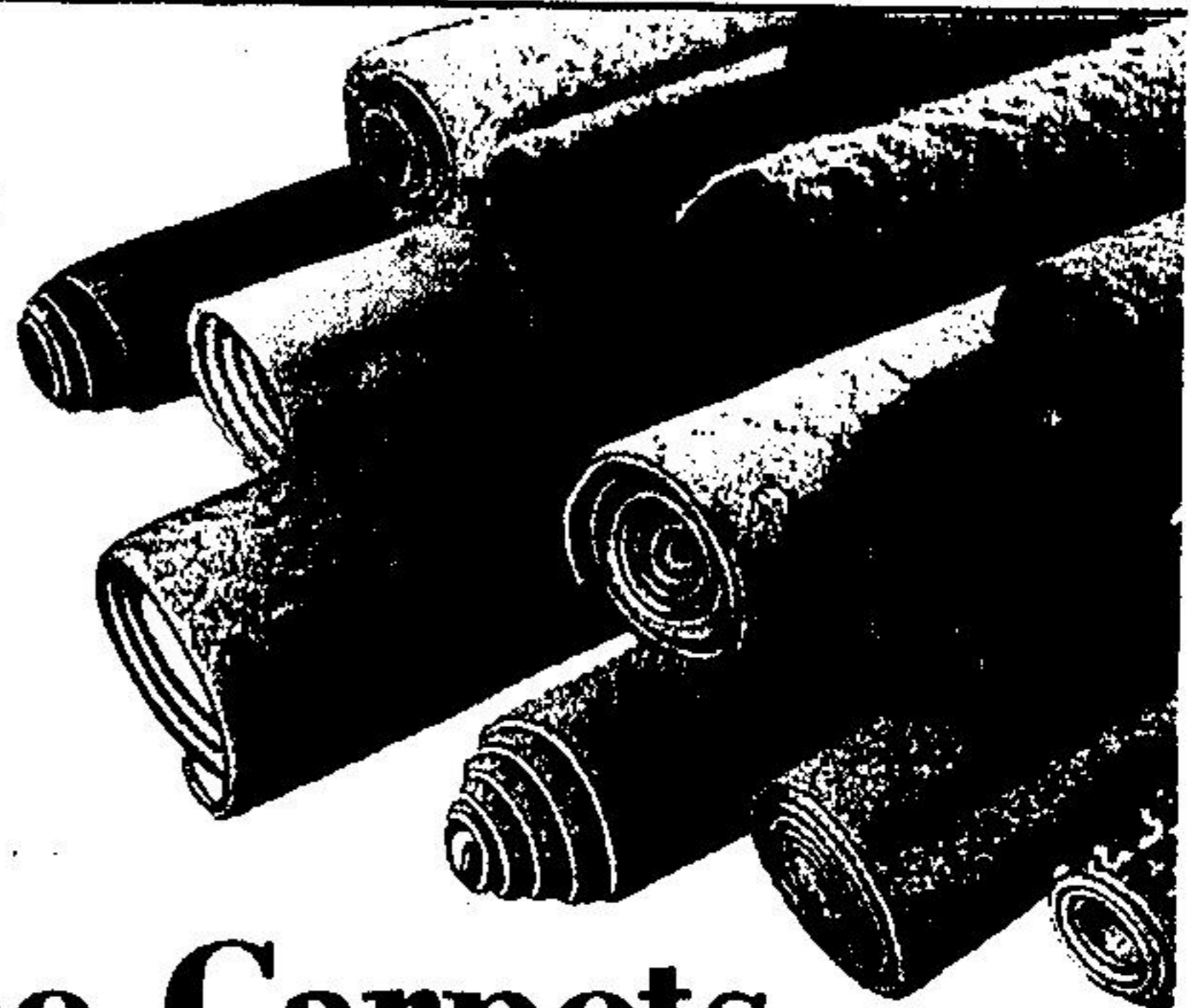
