Miller last cut of Blizzards

By BILL HUMPHREYS Gord Miller returned from the Toronto Blizzard training camp in Dunedin, Florida earlier this week full of experience for future years in the sport of soccer.

Miller was the Blizzard's third round draft pick earlier this year at the annual player selection in New York. He: was dropped from the profes-Sional club on March 21 on the 'eam's last cut day. Six other players were also sent home.

Miller was the second youngest player attending the training camp at the age of 18, second only to his 17 year old roommate from Don Mills, Toronto.

There were 45 players that attended this year's camp, 16 of whom were cut within the first two days from when the -camp first started on March

"The competition was really tough. I was quite happy that I made it to the last cut," Miller said.

During the camp Miller played in one exhibition game against the United States Olympic team, where he played 40 minutes of a 90-minute game.

"I felt really good to be able to put on a Blizzard uniform and the other play-, ers on the team really helped me out during the game, something which I wasn't used to during camp, because everybody was lighting for a job," Miller said.

Toronto ended up winning the game 3-0. On the last day the coach of the Blizzards, Keith Eddy, talked to Miller and said that they were pleased with his performances and quite possibly he could be playing for Toronto's reserve team, which practices with the big club during the summer.

Millers plans on attending a United State university next year where he can get an athletic scholarship.
