Middle school study criticized

The Halton board of education approved a \$7,000 study of the middle school concept to determine if it is more effective than other school systems. Dr. Robert Dixon, superintendent of program, has proposed the study as a component

of the board's long-term plan, to determine if the board should be expanding the number of middle schools in operation, or stay put with those already functioning.

Some of the trustees objected to the necessity of having outside people conduct the study, rather than using board staff members.

"I object to spending \$7,000 on the study," Fred Armitage said. "Dr. Dixon is fully qualified. I'm sure, to carry out this kind of study."

Halton Hills trustee Betty Fisher asked why the board staff aren't carrying out the study, and Dr. Dixon replied that the staff are currently busy with other in-house studies, and won't be able to take on another project for about a year. Dr. Dixon said that the results of the study are needed fairly soon in order to plan the boards' direction.

They include \$4,738 to the Halton Hills Parks and Recreation Department towards the construction of a clubhouse at the Gordon Alcott Recreation Complex, \$2,937 to Georgetown District Minor Hockey Association for equipment, \$1,436 to the Georgetown Minor Hockey Support Group for equipment, \$797 to the Aetion Minor Soccer Club towards the cost of equipment, \$699 to the Hornby Co-Operative Nursery School Inc. for program equipment, \$161 to the Ontario Pinto Horse Association in Hornby for a P.A. system for use in competitions and \$33 to the Georgetown District High School Swim Team towards expenses incurred in travelling to O.P.S.A.A. swim championships.

The employees will simply have to get their original application back and file again, he said.
