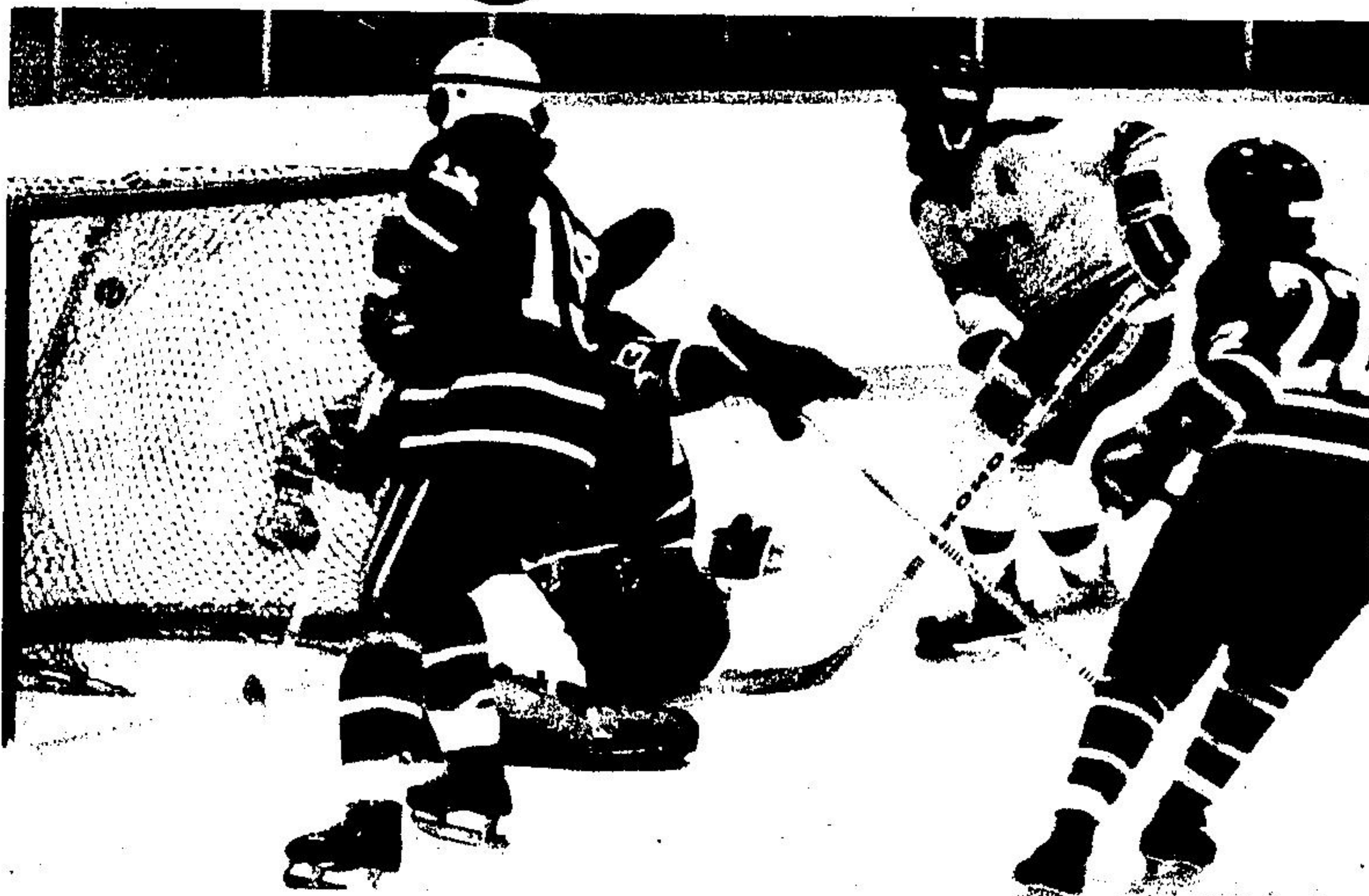

Bring on the north



Tom Daley scored here during first game action which the Georgetown Raiders lost by an 8-6 score to the Thorold Athletics. The Raiders came onto take the next four games and the series with Daley, who played his best hockey of the year during the series, being a major force.

The Georgetown Raiders thumped the Thorold Athletics 14-4 Monday night at Alcott Arena to win the C.G. Scotty Patterson Trophy as the Intermediate "A" OHA southern division championship in five games.

The Raiders will now face Port Elgin, the surprise northern division champions, to decide which club makes the trip to Timmons for the Eastern Canadian Championships.

The Raiders win over the Athletics was a classic case of snowballing. Georgetown started the series very slow, losing the first game here, but they took control a little more with each game and by the end they were totalling dominating the Athletics.

"The better team definitely won," said Athletic coach Bob Urquhart when it was over. "They'll go on to represent our division very well".

NOT INDICATIVE

The score of the final game was not indicative of the disparity between the two teams. The Athletics certainly are not in the same class as the Raiders, but they are not 10 goals worse. Once Georgetown built up a big lead, Thorold threw in the towel.

Georgetown was missing several key snipers for the contest, but coach Gerry Inglis said afterwards that he is hopeful they will all be back in time to face Port Elgin.

The biggest absentee was centre Ray Evans, who up until being injured was having a great series. He has been having troubles with his legs, but the two-game layoff should have been enough to get him ready for the final. Also missing were Brad Pirie, Pat Maloney and Archie Chase.

The Athletics were without the services of sniper Paul Sheehan and Gino Farinacci and Peter Mara also was not his usual self because of a groin injury.

The big guns for Georgetown, in the night of big guns, were Peter Sturgeon, three goals and an assist, Juri Kudrasovs, two goals and three assists, Bill Currie, a goal and three assists and Tom Daley with two goals and an assist.

However, everyone in red and white was dominated on this night as the Athletics, who appeared physically drained, offered little resistance for the Raiders.

Kris and Kelly finish third

Kris Barber and Kelly Johnson culminated a fantastic season by finishing a strong third in the dance pair competition in the Junior World Figure Skating Championships held at Augsburg, West Germany last week.

There were 21 dance pairs competing at the championships with 13 countries represented. Last year in Megeve, France, Barber and

Johnson finished second, but there were only nine dance pairs.

"The dancers were of the best quality we have ever competed against," said Barber, who is resting this week at his Glen Williams' home.

DEFEND TITLE

The Soviet Union dance pair of Tatiana Duarsova and Sergei Tonomarenko

successfully defended the title they won last year. Elena Batanova and Andrei Antonov, also of the Soviet Union, were second.

"We were very pleased with our showing," said Barber. "It was the best we have skated this year."

It was the first time this year Barber and Johnson have not finished first. They won the sectionals, the Eastern

Canadian championship and then the national crown.

This is the last year Barber and Johnson will compete as juniors. Next year they will be seniors and Barber said their goal will be to earn one of the two berths on the Canadian World team.

Next year the Olympics will be held at Lake Placid, New York and Canada will

be sending two dance pairs to the competition.

"It will be very difficult to earn a spot on the Olympic team because there are some very good senior skaters around," Barber said.

SENIOR TEST

Barber and Johnson will be taking their test to turn senior during the summer and then they hope to train in
