without the proper respect. Dr. Ted Taylor a nuclear physicist and former bomb designer warns against the proliferation of nuclear weap-

With so many reactors appearing around the world (220 now licensed with 320 additional reactors on order or under construction) there is a high risk of mis-use. All nuclear reactors produce plutonium. Plutonium that has been seperated and purified in a reprocessing plant can be used for weapons and fuel.

you may break him or he may break you - its all in the handling. Can it happen again? Dr. Arthur Porter of the Royal Commision on Electric Power Planning says "The more reactors you build the greater the chance of a deadly accident",

A built in risk factor, but we must remember that we live in a world of risks. Risks are a price we pay for technology and I believe that the benefits of our modern society out weigh the risks. After all, who can turn the wheel of progress in reverse - with all the motor car accidents who would want to go back to the horse and buggy? 




