A short circuit in an extension cord was blamed for starting a blaze in a Mill Street photographic studio Monday morning which injured one firefighter and did extensive damage to the studio. Capt. Pete Hayes received burns to the back of his neck in the blaze at Bill Garrard's studio but was not treated in Georgetown huspital. The fire, which was reported at 10:20 a.m., was confined to the studio and firefighters were able to bring it under control fairly rapidly even though it did considerable damage to the studio at the side of the Garrard home.
